This consists of providing care and treatment that is best for the baby.

The next phase of growth is the investing in neighborhoods with the construction of Ambulatory Care Centers. These centers, such as the one being built on Summit and the existing sites in Tiger Point and Perdido, provide right care at the right place and right time for patients. Free standing Emergency Departments are to be built in Navarre and 9 Mile Road.

Three elements that Dawn touched on when the topic of Change in Healthcare included:

- Healthcare should be a holistic approach that focuses on mind, body and soul. Emphasis on healthcare and not sick care.
- Understanding utilization and pathway of care. Clinically integrated system of care with standard protocol. This approach will help lessen the spend.
- Proper and timely access and not access points is the focus in providing health-care.
