WEEK IN REVIEW 03/21/2017

The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held on a beautiful windy March 21, 2017 at New World Landing. Members and guests were warmly greeted by Roger Vinson and Doug Werber. Jack Williams sold raffle tickets for a jackpot of \$40, won by Blair Crooke. President Sherry Hartnett called the meeting to order, led in the four way test and reminded that nominations are due for the Ethics in Business award. Dale Jordan led us in the prayer and pledge. President Sherry observed a moment of silence for the passing last week of two active members, Blaise Adams and Roger Enzor. John Appleyard presented to the club, the resolution memorializing the life of Roger Enzor which was accepted into the Club's records on a unanimous vote.

Madison Currin welcomed and introduced Lee Enzor, special guest and all the guests and visiting Rotarians. Betty Roberts introduced Michael Hamstra, VP of Marketing for AppRiver the program presenter for the day.

Michael provided an overview of security threats and offered a few tips for improving your chances of not getting hit with spam or malware. The main line of defense is to educate all employees about the threat of a breach to the network and train

them to be alert when using the network. Other tactics should be used such as limiting access to the network, backing up data frequently, developing a back up plan for replacing lost or damaged data, doing all software upgrades as soon as possible they most likely contain improved security functions, insisting on passwords that are not common names, dates or locations and have at least 8 characters, preference is to use phrases with at least 16 characters.

As time ran out on an interesting and important topic, President Sherry thanked all who served and the meeting was adjourned.
