Betty Roberts introduced our guest speaker: Judge Casey Rodgers and Gwendolyn Bills. Judge Rodgers spoke to us about the Naturalization Ceremony and the process to become an American Citizen. She invited all of our club members to attend one of the upcoming naturalization ceremonies . The first of which will be held on Friday April 21<sup>st</sup> at 10:00am. The ceremonies are currently being held at City Hall and The Naval Aviation Museum at NAS due to the work being done at the Courthouse.

To become a naturalized citizen is a long and costly process. The path to naturalized citizenship is a long and not easy path. The candidates must reside as a permanent resident in this country for a minimum of five years . The green card costs \$1,140.00, another \$649.00 application fee, and an additional \$85.00 for fingerprinting. The total cost is \$1,874.00. Applicants must pass a Civics test, an English exam and an extensive moral character background check. There are currently over 20,000 non-citizen members serving in the United States Military. 106,850 have been naturalized. Over 700,000 people have become naturalized citizens in 2015 and the number is expected to increase in 2016. The first naturalization ceremony in Pensacola was conducted by Andrew Jackson on July 17<sup>th</sup>, 1821.

President Sherry thanked our speakers and all of those who helped out with the meeting today. She then closed the meeting.


