WEEK IN REVIEW 04/23/2019

The regular meeting of the Downtown Rotary was held on beautiful Tuesday at New World Landing. Members were warmly greeted at the door by Charlie Sherrill and Richard Sherrill. Raffle tickets were sold by Auby Smith and Zack Smith. The meeting was called to order by President Betty who led us in the 4 Way Test. Charles Stewart led us in Prayer and Pledge. President Betty returned to the podium to make a few announcements. She reminded everyone that there is still time to make a pledge to the foundation and help bring our participation rate up to 100%. There is a membership drive underway and all potential new members will receive free lunch for the first three visits. Sunshine was provided by Pueschel Schneier who warmly welcomed our visiting Rotarians, Visitors, and Police Officers. Mark Harden then took the podium to introduce our guest speaker, Coach Jeffcoat. Coach Jeffcoat is the baseball coach at the University of West Florida. He has been the coach of the Argos since 2005 and has led a very successful team. The Argos are ranked sixth in the nation, with 452 wins and only 249 losses. The coach shared his thoughts with us about the

impact that a coach can have. A coach impacts more people in one year than most people do in a lifetime. Out of 30 starts, 5 are A game days, 5 are B game days and 20 starts will be C game days. The C game days have the most impact on a person, because you have to try harder. Coach went on to explain the way he feels about coaching and the impact that he feels he can have on these young men's lives. He feels that parents are sometimes too soft on kids and should say "no" once and awhile. Kids should learn to develop respect and work ethics and should learn to serve the community. Some of his favorite quotes are "Be on time" (which means arrive 5 minutes early). "Play or work with great effort". "Display positive body language" and "bring positive body language". These things are easy to do when you are winning, but what you do when you aren't winning is really more about who you are as person. The coach loves baseball, but also encourages kids to participate in other sports as well. The Coach also reaches out to community kids through outreach sports programs.
