President Sherry brought the meeting to order as ... surprise, Vicki Campbell led all in prayer and pledge. A few announcements included Scott Grisset discussing the family of Rotary event to be held at the Fish House deck on 4 June. Come one come all and enjoy a little fellowship on that Sunday from four to six o'clock. Sherry then asked for Rex McKinney to come up who was awarded with his Paul Harris +1 – congrats Rex.

Judge Stafford was the lucky recipient of Vicki's double duty collecting \$41 greenbacks which he promptly donated to the Foundation. Cal Moore was Sunshine

The Program. Retired Master Chief Mark Harden introduced our program -US Navy Captain Chris Martin. Commanding Officer (CO) of our own base - NAS Pensacola. The Skipper, prior enlisted, attended Auburn on a ROTC scholarship and became an E-2 Hawkeye pilot. Serving at various deployed and ashore commands across the county as he rose through the ranks prior to becoming CO at NAS Pensacola. As CO, he actually controls the infrastructure at several bases including Saufley Field, Corry Station, and even the Blue Angel recreation complex. With a replacement value of over \$3.6 billion and 1500 buildings, over 95 defense related tenants and 31 non-defense tenants reside at the

various bases. More stats include that the economic impact of NAS has increased from \$1.281 billion in 2012 to over \$2 billion for 2016. Pensacola is also one of only three bases that have an active cemetery on board and he noted that on average there is a funeral every 30 minutes. Wrapping up he discussed access to the base and the challenges they face moving forward. He expects that they will need \$18 million to fully alcove or separate areas like the museum. cemetery, and light house from the rest of the base so public access is easier. It will be a big challenge but they still have a few years to work out all the details. More information on the base can be found on their website or Facebook page - he even has a Twitter account.
