The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held on a beautiful Tuesday, May 16, 2017 at New World Landing, Alan Moore greeted members and quests at the door. Bo Carter did a great job ticket sales. Past President Andrea Krieger opened the meeting with the four way test and Shawn Brantley led us in prayer. Henry Roberts brought the sunshine for the day and welcomed Military guests, guests of Rotarians, and visiting Rotarians . Betty Roberts introduced the speaker, Quint Studer founder of the Studer Group, co-owner of the Blue Wahoos with his wife Rishv and Bubba Watson. Currently, Quint is involved with the newest organization Studer Community Institute a non-profit organization focused on improving the quality of life in Escambia and Santa Rosa. The goal of the Institute is to help people understand the issues we need to address to move Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties forward, Quint came to Pensacola to work with Baptist Hospital and credits Al Stubblefield with his arrival in Pensacola.

In 2000, Quint Studer founded The Studer Group, a company that provides the tools, experience, techniques and systems for the Healthcare Industry to improve organizational effectiveness and patient care. The success of the Studer Group opened the doors for Quint and Rishy Studer to seek new opportunities in entrepreneurship such as the Pensacola Blue Wahoos and the revival of downtown Pensacola. Quint founded the Studer Community Institute, a non-profit organization with the focus on improving the quality of life in Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties. The goal of the Institute is to help people understand the issues we need to address to move forward. The work of the Institute is based on the idea that measurements are needed to establish and meet goals. The Pensacola Dashboard is 16 metrics developed with UWF that provides a snapshot of the educational, social and economic well-being of the community. Statistics are developed and compared to other areas of similar size as Escambia and

Santa Rosa Counties and updated each year to determine the progress. Based on the statistics the focus is on Early Learning and Kindergarten Readiness as the number one need for improvement in the areas of jobs and education. Toward improving both areas, The Studer Community Institute provides skills training for small businesses, and entrepreneurs and the website offers tools and techniques for building stronger businesses. Pensacola is one of the first Early Learning Cities by focusing the entire community, healthcare, education and community on improving school readiness.

Quint provided an energetic and passionate speech about the achievable goals, although long term of improving the quality of life in the area. It is clear that Pensacola has much to be thankful for regarding the efforts of the Studer family.

Past President Andrea thanked all who served and the meeting was adjourned.
