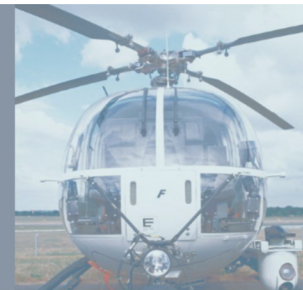

Mike Steltenkamp and Malcolm Thomas made sure of that as they joyfully greeted arriving participants for another excellent meeting. As customary, entrants must run the gauntlet past the 50/50 ticket sales to gain full entry. Offering chances to take home some cash were John Trawick and Hill Turner. Win or lose, the price was worth the smiles that came with the tickets.

President Betty Roberts greeted those present and formally opened the meeting with the introduction of the Rotary Rooters. A well-kept secret, this outstanding accapella ensemble entertained us while sharing historical events interspersed along the way. Learning is always fun in Rotary.

President Betty re-took the podium to share announcements, which included the membership drive now underway. Members are encouraged to bring potential members as a guest with up to three lunches paid for by the Club. While we are a large Club (but no longer the largest in the District), our demographics are such that recruiting new members are critical to ensuring the long-term viability of our Club.

Prayer and pledge were led by David Delgallo. Other opening remarks by Betty included reminders for the upcoming installations of our new District Governor featuring Innes Richards and the Club's new Board of Directors featuring John Trawick as our incoming President. During the opening segment Henry Roberts also presented the Paul Harris Award + 8 to Rotarian Bob Benz. The 50/50 jackpot of \$40 was won by Lynne Tobin. Charles Beall delivered Sunshine that included recognizing our two military guests and six member guests. There were no visiting Rotarians or birthday honorees present this week.

Ed McNally introduced the speaker: Jerry Maygarden. The list of Jerry's notable accomplishments are many. You can find several of

them listed in Wikipedia – yes, Rotarian Jerry Maygarden can be found in Wikipedia. Jerry's topic was the Louis Maygarden Center for Financial Literacy. It is named in honor of his father. Jerry reviewed some of his dad's involvement in the genesis of credit counselling back in the day. He also recognized several Club members who were instrumental in the idea and fruition of the Center.

Housed at UWF, the mission of the Louis Maygarden Center for Financial Literacy is to improve the financial health and well-being of residents in the UWF service area. Prevention through education and intervention through credit counseling are the two approaches utilized to fulfill its mission. Financial counselling services are tailored to the individual's needs and are performed by certified credit counsellors.

Regarding education, Jerry emphasized the need for early engagement in a person's education to address financial matters. He shared that he and Malcom Thomas partnered with Junior Achievement to begin offering six classes in financial basics at the middle school level beginning Fall '19. The program will launch in the 6th grades at the Workman and Beula schools at a cost of \$25K with a plan to add two more schools the following year. Nine middle schools, all in Escambia County, will eventually be included in this program. Over a thousand students are expected to be reached with this initial launch. Resources are obviously required for such an effort. Beyond financial contributions, volunteers are needed to deliver the classes.
