Our program. Repeat visitor Dr. Chris Warner, PH. D who is the author of over twenty books on college football's history and traditions plus other subjects. He was recently at our Club to talk about the Florabama and Joe Gilchrist. Chris is a graduate of LSU and his two daughters went to UA and Auburn – that must be a fun Iron Bowl. Chris discussed the history of college football which began just after the Civil War when the many southern universities and those in attendance were seeking an escape from the desperate times following the war. The game became immensely popular and very violent where death and permanent injury was common in the early years. Kentucky was the first school to join the Southern Football League (precursor to the SEC) and UF was the last. In 1905 the NCAA was formed and shortly the forward pass was introduced which even further expanded the game and its following. Dr. Warner went on to describe that tailgating really took off at the SEC schools in the late 1980's and 1990's and each school has their own traditions. From the "Grove" at Ole Miss or the "Junction" at Miss State tailgating is big business and bigger than the games themselves in many cases. These "All Day Parties' actually harken back to the day when football was only played in the daylight and the games were large social events/parties. Chris wrapped up by saying the he expects the SEC to increase to 16 teams and that as the predominant conference in the country that it will be even more powerful - probably more than the NCAA itself.
