WEEK IN REVIEW 10/20/2020

President Sally welcomed members to the October 20, 2020, meeting of the Pensacola Rotary Club by leading the Club in the 4 Way Test. She then reminded those of guiding theme of REEFs, which stands for recognition, education, engagement fellowship and service.

Rotarian Allison Hill led the gathering in a wish along with the Prayer and Pledge before handing off to Rotarian Chris Kelly, who introduced the meeting's speaker, Strider Elass. Strider Elass is Senior Economist at First Trust Advisors L.P., a financial services firm based in Wheaton, Illinois. At First Trust, Mr. Elass is responsible for analyzing economic indicators, writing economic commentaries and producing pieces on the First Trust Economics Blog. Mr. Elass is part of the First Trust economics team that Bloomberg has consecutively ranked as one of the top forecasters of the U.S. economy over the past several years. This First Trust economics team has also won Market Watch's "Forecaster of the Month" Award several times over the past few years. Out of a panel of over 100 economists, investment strategists, and housing market analysts, the First Trust economics team was awarded the "Crystal Ball Award" by Zillow® in partnership with Pulsenomics in 2012, 2013, and again most recently in 2014 for accurate home price predictions. Mr. Elass was also instrumental in researching for the book It's Not As Bad As You Think, published in 2009 by First Trust Chief Economist Brian Wesbury. Beyond his research responsibilities, Mr. Elass speaks regularly at broker and retail events around the country and abroad. Mr. Elass received a B.A. in Business and Economics from Wheaton College, in Wheaton, Illinois and is currently a candidate in the CFA Program.

Mr. Elass was booked during Hurricane Sallie and was speaking from a hotel in Las Vegas. Lot that is going on with this pandemic and social media presenting fear of Covid-19. 1/3 of total deaths are individuals over the age of 85 years old. Mentioned the misallocation of resources because of this fear and how it has devastated the economy. Good news is data is improving but still have a long way to go. Nationwide hotel occupancy is down 25 to 35% but improving. Travel off 75% to prior year. Spoke about what will change with results of Presidential election. Mr. Elass also mentioned how it might take time (even years) for a lot of these changes (tax rates, etc.) to take place. The rest of the discussion was based on what the rest of the year should look like in the stock market, investments, and a possible stimulus package. Ended with a summary how things are not as bad as it appears by giving some historical perspective. Mr. Elass then took questions from the audience.
