The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held at New World Landing on a cold but sunny Tuesday after Thanksgiving November 27, 2018. President Betty Roberts called the meeting to order and led us in the Four Way Test. Henry Roberts provided an update on giving just in time for the end of year. To date the Foundation Fund raising has reached only 20% of the annual goal. Congratulations to Dale Jordan for being the lucky winner of the jackpot. Hugh Hamilton led us in a prayer and pledge to the flag. The Appleyard moments for this day in Pensacola History were about remembering the first day of trading with the Indians by Panton and Leslie and years later the announcement that Pensacola was selected to become home the Navy's shipyard and maintenance facility. Scott Grissett thanked all volunteers for the Salvation Army Kettle drive and welcomed any new volunteers, before entertaining with jokes and welcoming visitors. Auby Smith, Dave Galloway and Randy Ray celebrated birthdays this week. President Betty introduced Dean Debolt, from the University of West Florida, University Archives and West Florida History Center. The University Archives and

West Florida History Center is home to one of the largest research collections in existence on the history and development of West Florida from its earliest settlement to the present. It functions as an information center serving the communities in the Panhandle and West Florida. The center is a repository of more than 720 collections and 1.5 million items. Collections may consist of personal papers, manuscripts, genealogical records, records from businesses, religious and other organizations, maps, artifacts and audio and visual materials relating to the West Florida region. Some items date back to the 1400's and include items from the earliest settlement to the present. The items are catalogued for use by students and others who may access the John C. Pace Library for research whether it is academic, personal or business related. Most items are donated by collectors, sometimes by request of the University, some items are purchased and some are found by staff in the quest for current and past information on the West Florida region and its history. Mr. Debolt related some interesting stories regarding the uncovering of unusual and historic items in stored materials most may think of as trash. After a very interesting presentation, President thanked all who helped with the meeting and the meeting was adjourned.
