#### WEEK IN REVIEW 12/15/2020

The December 15, 2020 Zoom meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was called to order at 12:03pm by President Sally Fox. She led the Four-Way Test and reminded everyone of the meeting goals, REEFS, an acronym for Recognition, Education, Engagement, Fun, and Service. Rotarian Scott Sallis led prayer and pledge. There were Zoom 55 participants.

Rotarian Betty Roberts introduced the speaker, Jerome (Jerry) Shannon, director of the Pensacola Opera, who was actually celebrating his birthday. Shannon said these are challenging times for everyone, especially arts, culture and entertainment organizations. Pensacola Opera is one of 12% of arts organizations that have remained open during pandemic. 40% of non-profits have no plans to reopen and don't know if they will be able to. The NEA gave \$50,000 to Pensacola Opera to continue the artist-in-residence program, which hosts 5 young artists. There are more than double the number of applications for next season (usually 400, this year more than 800). They also received an IMPACT 100 grant to buy a new opera van, for artists to travel around community. The "Wenger Showmobile" is a mobile pop-up stage that will attach to van.

While they had to close last season early, 65% of "II Trovatore" ticketholders donated the value of their tickets back to the company. They are moving forward with "Carmen" production in January at the Saenger, the 1500-seat capacity reduced to 380, so three performances instead of two. The rest of the season includes "HMS Pinafore" in March and "Heartbreak High" (version of "Elixir of Love" set in 1950s high school) in May. Shannon is very proud of Pensacola Opera's work with community partners (Saenger, Symphony, Children's Chorus) to make sure community will continue to have art in a safe, responsible manner. Two singers (Rachel and Olivia) led a series of carols: Here We Come A Wassailing, Joy to the World, It Came Upon the Midnight Clear, Silent Night, Deck the Halls, Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming, O Little Town of Bethlehem, Jingle Bells, O Holy Night, We Wish You A Merry Christmas. President Fox thanked Jerry and the singers.

Mayor Grover Robinson led sunshine and celebrated the birthdays for the remainder of the year: Ray Jones, Scott Barrow, Eric Bostwick, Jerry Maygarden, Alan Moore, LaVonne Agerton, and Dale Jordan. He

An update on our meeting venue: New World will not reopen ballroom, and Skopelos will not reopen at the location, so we will be looking for new venue. She also thanked Chris Bridwell for all her work to make meetings happen. Another acronym to close out the year, THANKS: Together, Health, Abundance, Nurture, Knowledge, and Service above self.
