Vicki Campbell handled Sunshine duties and entertained us with holiday humor. She introduced visiting Rotarians, and guests of Rotarians, including several spouses.

Mark Harden introduced our guest speaker, Jerome Shannon, artistic director of the Pensacola Opera. Pensacola Opera is entering its 36<sup>th</sup> season and is considered one of the fastest growing operas in the country.

They will perform over 100 times in local retirement homes and schools. Mr. Shannon estimated that more than 20,000 children will experience opera as a result of these appearances.

Next, was a brief Q&A session, followed by a wonderful performance of carols by four of our guest singers from the Pensacola Opera, all dressed in Dickens's apparel. They were followed by the Rotary Rooters who led us in singing more carols with our traditional "Twelve Days of Christmas" as the finale.
