WEEK IN REVIEW 3/2/2021

The March 2, 2021 meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was called to order at 12:04pm by President Sally Fox. The meeting was held via Zoom and had 51 participants. She led the Four-Way Test and reminded everyone of her "REEFS" goal: Recognition, Education, Engagement, Fun, and Service. She also shared the sad news that Rotarian David Galloway passed away.

Rotarian Charlie Sherrill led the prayer and pledge. The week's speaker was Rotarian Verdell Hawkins, the economic development manager at Gulf Power. He previously served with Mississippi Power for many years and as an urban planner in Atlanta. Verdell said that every meeting at Gulf Power begins with a safety briefing, and he wanted to do the same here. He gave an update on what's been going on with Gulf Power since changing from Southern Company to NextEra to Florida Power & Light (FPL), their investments in cleaner energy and a smarter grid, a commitment to strengthening the community, their COVID-19 response, storm season preparations, and other highlights.

He said that FCL's being home-based in Juno Beach, Florida is a benefit to the local company. FPL's power bills are among the lowest in the nation, and the company is committed to renewables (like the "30-by-30" solar plan) and is also innovating in battery storage. The Gulf Power name will continue to be used throughout 2021 but will change to FPL on Jan. 1, 2022. A rate structure change is expected to make the typical power bill lower than it is today. Three solar installations: Blue Indigo now in service, and Cotton Creek and Blue Springs will begin construction soon. Each installation can generate 74.5 MW, which is enough to power 15,000 homes. Solar trees have been installed in Destin, Ft Walton Beach and Pensacola. Plant Crist is being renamed "Gulf Clean Energy Center" as it transitions from coal to all natural gas, reducing carbon emissions by 40%. The North Florida Resiliency Connection (176-mile 161 kV transmission line) will start construction in next few months, enhancing reliability and resiliency. All wooden structures are being replaced with concrete or steel poles with smart grid equipment that notifies system of outages with limited "self heal" capabilities. Customer service is being improved with new mobile app with self-service and bill pay. The transition to FPL means 50% better reliability. In response to Covid-19, Gulf Power has offered a one-time 40% bill decrease in May 2020, suspended disconnections, and offered bill relief credits up to \$200. They've contributed over \$1 million in United Way donations, small business grants, and other initiatives. Thanks to partnerships, crews were able to restore power to nearly all customers within five days of Hurricane Sally, and they are always focused on improving storm response. They believe in economic development and recently hosted a virtual Economic Symposium out of Covid safety concerns. The next in-person Economic Symposium is scheduled for Sept. 14-15 at the Sandestin Golf & Beach Resort. Gulf Power still has a local external relations team and is committed to helping the Northwest Florida community.

Rotarian John Tice asked if it's true that Walton County rejected a proposal

for a solar energy installation. Verdell said it's true. They're hoping that feedback from Jackson County will educate officials and plan to present a revised proposal. Rotarian Ed Ranelli asked about plans for the Gulf Power building on Bayfront Parkway. Verdell said they're not planning to sell it at this time, but have been talking to like-minded industries that might lease the property. President Fox thanked Verdell and said a book would be donated to a local elementary school in his name.

Paul Tobin presented a resolution recognizing the life and contributions of Paul Leonard Young (1944-2021), who was a Rotary member for 25 years and a Paul Harris Fellow before moving to Maryland to be closer to family. Scott Sallis presented the Sunshine and welcomed visitors Gay Nord, CEO of West Florida Hospital, and Jeffrey Von Stein with Pensacola Public Adjustors. He wished happy birthday to Joe Vinson before Alexa took away his Zoom connection. President Fox said we are planning to return to in-person meetings on March 23 and asked for help from any technology-savvy members who can help with offering a virtual solution. Rotarian Andrea Krieger volunteered to help but said that the Internet connection at the Yacht Club is unreliable. Using a cell phone hotspot can help, but others may need to offer their hotspots. New member orientation will take place on Zoom, Thursday, March 4 from 5-7:00 pm. President Fox reminded everyone to update any information and photos for the member directory.

Sergeant-at-arms Scott Grissett was charged by President Fox to come up with a new way (in addition to Member Moments) to highlight individual members, which he has named "Chopper" after the Helicopter. The concept is to give three little-known facts about an anonymous Rotarian and try to guess their identity. The first example: was a capable T-ball player, was an athlete at Suwanee, and appeared on NFL Hall-of-Famer Terrell Owens' reality TV show. The Rotarian in question was Scott himself, to show how easy and fun this new exercise could be.

President Fox thanked Betty Roberts for her efforts to get us in the Rotary district newsletter. Ed Wonders spoke about Rotary license plates. We need to have at least 3,000 people who will sign up for it and pay a \$30 application fee. President Fox mentioned that Ethics in Business Award nominations will open soon, and she reminded everyone that community grant applications are due on March 15. If anyone has ideas for district grants, please let the committee know about them.

Rotary has a program called Rotary Works, with the next seminar on March 10 on "essential tools for marketability." There's a Rotary app that can provide local discounts. Closing quote: "Never doubt a thoughtful group of committed citizens can change the world." Meeting adjourned at 1:02pm. Minutes submitted by Joe Vinson.
