President Sally kicked off the second in person meeting with over 30 on Zoom so it was a full house. Sad news included the passing away of former member Glenn McDonald and the passing of LaVonne Agerton's husband, Archie.

And we were off to the program: Chris Kelly introduced Chris Warner who has written a book about a place most all are familiar with --- the Flora-Bama and its proprietor, who needs no introduction, the infamous Joe Gilchrist.

Chris Warner is a Ph.D and author of several books--his most famous being a book about SEC tailgating and other SEC football folklore. And another on the HealthSouth CEO called "Wagon to Disaster" which has brought much notoriety. Chris went on to describe how he was introduced to Joe (by his brother) and why he was writing the book. Meeting Joe in 2010 in the immediate aftermath of the recession where Joe was suffering some devastating real estates losses and about to lose the Flora-Bama, Chris knew that this was a story that needed to be told about how Joe had come to acquire the bar that is an institution. Following a statement made to Chris by Joe, "You could be a lot more useless in life" Chris, who was also going through some personal issues, began to document the beginning of the bar in the early 1960's and how Joe ended up with it. Not going into all the details, but basically the Flora-Bama was the only bar in the area from 1964-78 and became famous for its live music and eclectic performers and crowds. In a nutshell, Joe bought the bar in 1978 from the original family that started it and took it to new levels when in 1984 a ex-navy man Pat, joined as the marketing guru. The rest is history following events like the mullet toss and the skinny dipping following hurricane Fredrick in 1979. Back to 2010, Joe was able to save the bar from the creditors through new partners and adding additional properties across the street – currently it stands as premier destination on the Key. Book is available on Amazon and is a must read for all locals ...
