WEEK IN REVIEW 8/17/2021

The meeting was called to order by President Ed Wonders at 12:04 p.m. The meeting took place on zoom, as the yacht club was closed. President Wonders led is in the four-way test. Vince led us in the prayer and pledge.

Joe Vincent introduced our guest speakers, Lloyd and Robin Reshard, founders of The Kakua Institute. Kukua means "growth" in Swahili.

The idea for the Kukua Institute began in 2016 when they saved the D. Allen Berg house, which was built in 1884 - 85, from being demolished at Belmont / Devilliers. They moved the house to 422 North Coyle Street and named it the Ezra research Center, after a newspaper article in 1907. They felt his life is worth examining. He died along with 150 crew and passengers in a steamboat accident. The research center teaches the use of robotics and artificial intelligence to college students.

When completed, the Kukua Institute will be an art and history museum about belmont/Devilliers. It will feature a virtual reality space that brings history into modern day. It covers from the years 1880 to 1930, when over 3000 people who lived in Belmont / Devilliers. Over 80% were very prosperous black business owners. There were also some Greeks, Filipinos, Italians, and Jewish people living in the neighborhood at that time. Some examples of some of the activity going on in the neighborhood were numerous clubs, department stores, real estate brokers, Banks, including the People's Cooperative, which was founded by Wade Harvey, who financed to

African Americans for real estate, newspapers, including The Florida Sentinel and The Colored Citizen. The first hospital owned by an African American, Viola Edwards Colored Hospital, which was there from 1922 to 1927. Mrs Newton's School of Dance for housewives, the African-American Industrial Insurance Company, Barefoot Barber/ Podiatrist, a beauty shop owned by Myrtle Brown and her sister Elsie, who were both school teachers.

In 1956 Bruce Beach opened a segregated pool for African Americans, which offered swimming lessons and water ballet and had only African-American lifeguards. Black politicians referred to it as a dipping bath because it wasn't big. It wasn't adequate for the community.

The Kakua Institute offers visual representations of local black history, which is important to preserve.

After the speaking and question session, President Wonders introduced Scott Ford, who did the sunshine and introduced and welcomed guests and announced birthdays. President wonders and formed everyone it was Black cat appreciation Day and national nonprofit day. Next week our guest speaker will be Coach Shinnick. The meeting is scheduled to be an in-person event at the yacht club, with a board meeting following immediately after. The meeting was adjourned at 1:01 p.m.
