WEEK IN REVIEW 9/21/2021

The September 21 meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was called to order by President Wonders at 12:06 pm. Participants included 38 members via Zoom. Rotarian Robert Stephens led us in the prayer and pledge.

The Rotary Club of Pensacola Program Chair, Joe Vinson, welcomed the guest speaker, John Peacock. He is a charter financial consultant with Edward Jones who is well-known in our community for his activism and philanthropy. He currently serves on the boards of the UWF Foundation and the UWF Historic Trust, and has served on many more, including the Greater Pensacola Chamber, the DIB, and the Council on Aging, to name a few. He created the Panhandle Charitable Open, which over 18 years raised nearly \$1.8 million for charitable causes in memory of his son John Ryan Peacock as well as Ashley Lauren Offerdahl. One of the organizations that has benefited greatly from John's efforts is Gulf Coast Kid's House. Several years ago, he was involved in the community effort to review and replace the City of Pensacola's charter.

John shared his vision for charter government in Escambia County. He began his remarks by listing the many of the community's assets:

- Large employers such as GE, International Paper, Ascend

With all of the assets and amenities in Escambia County, why is the community struggling? There's an old saying that "Shared responsibility means no one is responsible. Without responsibility and accountability very little happens."

While the City of Pensacola changed to a Mayor/Council form of government in 2010, Escambia County remains governed by a Commissioner/Manager form of government with 5 commissioners elected by district only (single member district). Escambia County has grown less than neighboring Santa Rosa. Escambia grapples with environmental issues, poorly performing schools, under-resourced households, and a lack of strategic planning. Leaders are not utilizing all of county assets for the betterment of the citizens. Now is the time to effect change.

Starting back in 2008, a "Quality of Life" Survey provided insights into how citizens view the community. The thought process was that by measuring public opinion in an annual survey and collecting data for comparison, the material would be used to generate informed debate and inspire necessary action. Public officials have failed to address the concerns of the citizens.

Escambia residents may only vote for one commissioner. This forces each commissioner to focus on their own district instead of the entire community.

John concluded his remarks by asking, "Is there a better way? Twenty out of 67 counties in Florida have charter governments. Over 75 percent of people live in a charter county. The political structure can be tailored by the local electorate."

Peacock's group will be on the County Commission Agenda on Nov 9. Peacock entertained several questions and asked the members to write letters to the County Commission.

President Wonders thanked our speaker and then educated the members on (1) National Pecan Cookie Day. Rotarian Ed enjoyed a cookie on zoom; (2) National Chai Day – a spicy drink fit for a king; and (3) National IT Professional Day.

Rotarian Sally Fox hosted an Irish themed sunshine. She made the members chuckle with Irish glee. Birthday greetings for four Rotarians were announced followed by a chorus of Happy Birthday.

President Wonders thanked all for their role in the meeting. He adjourned at 12:41 pm
