#### **MINUTES**

Cool inside air and the smiling faces of Dale Jordan and Danny Kahn greeted attendees of the noon meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola. Raffle tickets were sold by Jules Kariher and David Harrison. President Ray brought the meeting to order with the Four Way Test followed by Shawn Brantley leading us in prayer and pledge to our Nations flag. President Ray announced a sign-up sheet was available for the Habitat for Humanity June 24th club service project. Also, the club will have the installation banquet at Heritage Hall, Seville Quarter, at 5:30, June 28th. There will be no noon club meeting that date.

President Ray brought our attention to the NCAA College Baseball National Champion Trophy displayed at the podium and asked club member and UWF President Judy Bense and head baseball coach, Mike Jeffcoat to come forward. After a standing ovation, Coach Jeffcoat let us know how proud he was to bring this championship to the University and Northwest Florida. The players did well representing the University and our area being nationally televised on CBS Sports. President Ray then introduced our newest Paul Harris recipient, Malcolm Thomas.

Up next were the Rotary Rooters with a harmonious presentation of the history of the railroad in Northwest Florida. The first railroad was built in 1861 and later destroyed by the Confederate Army during the Civil War. Rebuilt in 1870, and added to by several companies, the railroad helped the growth and development in our area. Speaking of baseball, Richard Sherrill was called for strike one on his first attempt at bringing us Sunshine. Richard rallied by introducing our visitors but got the strike two call with his second joke. Not to be held down, Richard rallied again introducing visiting Rotarians and leading us in wishes to those having a birthday this week. Chris Kelly introduced our program and speakers Dr. Ellen and Charles Neal who raise dogs for the Southeastern Guide Dog program. The dogs are obtained from a

special breeding kennel and raised by trainers from puppy until transferred to the client. The dogs are taught to socialize with others, especially children and other dogs. They also need a lot of exercise. This helps with their behavior in locations as hotels, restaurants and aircraft. The approximate invested cost per dog is \$60,000. The dogs are given free to blind applicants. Training groups work together to keep everyone on the same page during the puppies training. Dogs cannot be exposed to playing with balls, Frisbee, or other similar toys that may distract them when leading a blind person. Physical exams of dogs is required to detect hip dysplasia or other conditions that may be present. There are currently five guide dogs being trained in our area and the Neal's are training their fourth dog.
