The ground breaking took place in 1951 lead by these and other local contributors and the operation was carried forward by the first Administrator, Pat

Groner. Jim Vickery became the second Administrator in 1983, followed in 1999 by Al.

The average cost per bed for a new hospital today runs one and one half million dollars. The early pioneers of Baptist had to work very hard raising the funds to begin operation as a non-profit organization. Who owns Baptist Health Care? The community does. A voluntary group of 27 regional members elect the board of directors who oversee this 700 million dollar in annual revenue operation. The main drive and focus of Baptist Health Care is taking care of the patients that they have the privilege of working with. An invitation was given to all to attend the birthday celebration on Thursday, October 27th from 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. at the Avery St., Tower II entrance.
