WEEK IN REVIEW

Rotarians received a warm greeting on this rainy day from Bret Barrow and Nora Bailey. President Alan called the meeting to order with a big "Roll Tide" with congratulations to both Alabama and LSU for great seasons. Prayer and pledge was led by Neal Goldsborough.

President Alan announced that Rotary International is sponsoring a trip to India and our own Julie Tippins Parker is attending. She is one of only 40 Rotarians in the U.S. participating. President Alan also reminded us all to mark our calendars for Saturday February 25 for the Rotarians Against Hunger project where we will package 82,000 meals for the hungry. The event will be held at Manna Food Bank with two shifts: 8 a.m. - 10 a.m. and 10 a.m. - noon. Bobby Behr was the lucky raffle winner today, taking home \$46, thanks to the ticket sales efforts of Tony Basel.

Mr. Sunshine Richard Sherrill told

a few jokes, most of which were quite funny once the crowd thought about them for a few minutes. He then welcomed all Rotary guests. Those with birthdays this week were announced and Richard led the club in singing Happy Birthday to You All accompanied by John Appleyard on harmonica.

John Shaffer introduced today's speaker, Jeff Helms, vice president of Peter R. Brown Construction, Inc., an Atkins company, to speak with us about the Whiting Aviation Park airport master plan. He said that Whiting Field in Milton is the busiest naval air station in the world. More than 1,200 service personnel complete their essential flight training there yearly. And, they have 1,500 military jobs and 1,370 civilian jobs.

Jeff introduced Santa Rosa County Commissioner Don Salter who spoke about why they are building a business park adjacent to this jewel of a military base. Industrial development around a military base is the most compatible use, as compared to housing for example. Santa Rosa County negotiated a unique limited access use agreement with the U.S. Navy. The Navy will provide 6,000-foot runway access and will monitor airspace. The Park will enable a lot of the aircraft maintenance work to be kept nearby rather than it going out of state as it currently is. And, the Park will make Whiting Field more efficient than it is today.

The 269 acre development will be built in phases. The initial start-up groundwork will cost about \$2.5 million, with Phase 1 costing approximately \$12 million. Jeff estimates this Park will generate 2,300 jobs over the next 10 to 20 years. They are looking at two good prospects for the Park now, and all indicators are that this initiative will be successful.

President Alan led everyone in the Four-Way Test then adjourned the meeting.
