WEEK IN REVIEW

The April 11, 2012 meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola took place at New World Landing on a beautiful spring day. Rotarians Hugh Hamilton and Maria Goldberg greeted arriving Rotarians, and John Clark handled raffle ticket sales, of which \$86 went to a lucky Rotarian. President Alan had three pairs of Blue Wahoo tickets to raffle, and chose to donate two pair to the two military guests. Paula Turner's husband, Murray, having a Rotary lunch with us won the other pair.

President Alan held a moment of silence for the good friend of many, Jack Weller, who lost a long battle with Alzheimer's last week.

John Trawick led the group in thoughtful prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance. Dr. Jimmy Jones handled Sunshine duties and jokes, and he welcomed a handful of guests and visiting Rotarians from other clubs. The Rotary Rooters entertained the lively crowd with renditions of "Down Pensacola Way" and the timely "Take Me Out To The Ball Game!" President Alan congratulated our own Roger McDonald for throwing out the first pitch, a called strike, at the Blue Wahoo's opening game. Alan also congratulated Collier Merrill for throwing the first wild pitch at Wahoo Stadium.

Scott Sallis and Maria Goldberg introduced today's guest speaker, Mr. Kim Kimbrough, the executive director of the Pensacola Downtown Improvement Board (DIB). Kim was selected from a pool of 23 candidates on September 10, 2004, and began serving on September 15, the day before Hurricane Ivan made landfall. A native of Baldwin County, Kimbrough received a bachelor's degree from the University of South Alabama and his master's degree from the University of Mississippi. He was previously the president and CEO of the Portland Business Alliance in Oregon; president and CEO of the Downtown St. Louis Partnership in Missouri; director of the Department of Downtown Development in Franklin, Virginia; and main street manager of the Panama City DIB in 1985.

Kim said although hurricane Ivan wreaked havoc throughout downtown Pensacola, it kick-started an initiative to revitalize downtown in many ways. The DIB's mission was to attract more retail business, more residents, and more tourists to the 44-block area. In 2007, they adopted a retail strategy to encourage existing and incoming businesses to enhance retail areas by collectively using creative signage, not over-doing window advertising, staying open later and on

Saturdays, and generally making downtown more pedestrian-friendly. The DIB concentrated on public areas and traffic changes such as lobbying for twoway traffic on Palafox, establishing specific loading zones and times for Palafox, slowing traffic on Jefferson by adding 4-way stops, beautifying walkways and sidewalks, and decorating for Christmas and patriotic holidays. The DIB also lead an effort to save the downtown post office from the government axe, an important hub in the center of the retail area. Through these efforts, about 80% of downtown retailers are open later in the evenings and are open on Saturdays and throughout special events. The seasonal Palafox Public Market attracts an average of 3,000 shoppers daily. Kim reported that over 20% of all retail sales are from shoppers from outside the Northwest Florida - South Alabama area, and according to statistics, Downtown Pensacola is growing at a pace far ahead of the region as a whole, thanks to Kim and the DIB.

President Alan thanked everyone who made today's meeting a success and adjourned at 1:00.
