The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held on Tuesday, July 17 under hot and hazy summer skies. Rotarians and their guests were greeted at the door by Bill Mitchem and Jim Stolhanske. Raffle ticket sales were handled by the team of Jock Mobley and John Monroe who succeeded in ginning up a pot of \$80. President Innes called the meeting to order and led the group in the Four Way Test. Leonard Schwartz was called to the podium and delivered a praver that sequed directly into the pledge to our nation's flag. President Innes then announced a Foundation Seminar to be held on August 4. The primary change will be the subscription structure of the PNJ which will result in a slight increase to the paper subscription and a charge for access to the pni.com known as a paywall. As of this October, the PNJ will be the largest daily published between Jacksonville and New Orleans. Many other major newspapers have

decreased publication to as little as 3 days a week. The PNJ is able to continue daily publication thanks to smart management decisions and the ability to cut costs while maintaining a successful news gathering infrastructure. Ms. Nickinson stated that every article written by PNJ staff is reviewed by several sets of eyes in order to insure that the PNJ lives up to the journalism credo of fair and balanced. Shannon then opened up the floor to questions and received many insightful inquests from the Rotarians in attendance. There was a suggestion for more state news and an inquiry as to the need for a "shock jock" style cartoonist. Another Rotarian asked why the editorials did not include specific names of the PNJ editorial staff forming the basis of the contents of editorials. Ms. Nickinson stated is was standard policy throughout the newspaper industry to do so. Scott thanked Shannon for sharing her thoughts with the club and bestowed upon her the ceremonial fine china coffee mua.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
