John was recently honored as the 2011 Emergency Manager of the Year for the state of Florida. We are fortunate to have such a seasoned professional at the helm of our Emergency Management program. John reminded the group that the hurricane season runs from June 1 to November 30 so we are clearly not out of the woods quite yet although cooler temperatures serve to lower the water temperature in the Gulf of Mexico which serves to reduce the probability of late season hurricanes. John reflected on the heavy hurricane activity on 2004 and 2005 and the direct hits we took from Ivan and Dennis. The various effects of hurricanes were discussed including storm surge, heavy

rainfall, high winds and tornados. mentioned the importance of knowing if your home is located in an evacuation zone - this information can be found on the BeReadyEscambia.com website. It is very important to know if you reside in one of these zones so that you can react accordingly at the onset of a hurricane and the flooding that normally takes place. Other preparation steps include placing loose objects inside your house or garage, insure that you have sufficient supplies to help you sustain the initial 72 hour period after the hurricane and be aware of evacuation routes. Nearly all residents of our area have become adept and the proper preparation and those who have lived through Erin, Opal, Ivan and Dennis probably have a tried and tested storm routine. In addtion to having a plan for your family it is also important to have a plan for your business - tips for a disaster recovery plan can be found FloridaDisaster.org. There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
