

WEEK IN REVIEW

The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held at New World Landing on a spectacular fall Tuesday, October 23, 2012. Terry Terrell and Malcolm Thomas welcomed members and quests at the door. John Tice and Paul Tobin did a great job of ticket sales. The lottery winner, Jim Stolhanske collected \$71. President Innes Richards called the meeting to order and led us in the four way test. President Innes announced that the Rotary Club of Pensacola can now be found on Face book and Twitter, thanks to some enterprising members of the Club. Martin Harwood was recognized for his efforts in coordinating a very successful Rotary Leadership Institute training session last weekend with approximately 30 participants. Ted Brown announced the ioint meeting of the Propeller Club with the Pensacola Young Professionals to be held at Seville on Wednesday, October 24. The topic is Gulf Ports and Economic Development. Scott Grissett announced the next Family of Rotary event for November 15, 2012 from 5:00 -7:00 at the Maritime Park. Entrance fee is \$15 and includes a park tour and snacks. Tours and information will be available on the Blue Wahoos Stadium and Park. Reminder that there will not be a meeting on Tuesday, November 6, the joint meeting in honor of Veteran's day will be Monday, November 5, 2012. Rodger Doyle led us in the Prayer and Pledge. Hugh Hamilton provided sunshine and introduced and welcomed the Military Guest, Guests of Rotarians and visiting Rotarians. Birthday greetings went

out to Paul Tobin, Gene Killinger, Alexis Bolin, Jeff Powell and Bill Davis in attendance.

Scott Grissett introduced Capt. Susan K. Cerovsky. Commanding Officer for the Center for Information Dominance, (CID) stationed at Corry Field, Pensacola, Florida. Captain Cerovsky who has served and trained all over the world, lived in Mobile, Alabama and attended the University of South Alabama and has now returned to the Gulf Coast as the Leader of the Center for Information Dominance Command. The mission of the CID is to develop, maintain and protect the systems required for cyber space dominance by the United States military and train the cyber security experts needed to fulfill the mission. The CID is composed of four Commands with 16 training sites located in all parts of the Globe and Captain Cerovsky leads the command from Corry Station. The schools are located throughout the world and employ a workforce of over 12,000. composed of military, contract and civilians from the various local areas. The CID has over \$180M in training equipment and occupies over 673,000 square feet of workspace. The CID trains airmen, soldiers, as well as officers and works with all other government agencies to provide training. The largest school, located at Corry Field, has an average of 2000 students per day in the classroom. Captain Cerovsky reminded us that the threat of cyber attacks is real and ever expanding. The vulnerabilities and risks that come with

the advances in cyber technology and defense systems are challenging. The most severe security breach occurred in 2008 when a virus was loaded on to a computer via a flash drive and spread throughout the US security network. The program allowed a huge amount of sensitive data to be retrieved from the system, this one program has accounted for the largest single loss of data to espionage in U.S. history. The CID is dedicated to the dominance of the United States in cyber space and continually works to train service men to deploy the weapon and defense systems in place and prevent adversaries from obtaining critical command and control information to develop counter measures. The CID also emphasizes leadership and mentoring among the students and provides opportunities for growth in those areas. Captain Cerovsky fielded questions and provided a great deal of information regarding the CID training in Pensacola.

President Innes thanked all who served and the meeting was adjourned.
