President Innes Richards called the meeting to order and led the club in the Four Way Test. She then called on Rotarian Rodger Doyle to lead us in prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to our flag.

President Innes then called on Maria Goldberg who came to the podium to remind Rotarians of the Family of Rotary night being planned for Thursday, January 31st at 5 to 7 PM at Palafox House located on the corner of Palafox and Gregory Streets. The event is free, but there is a cash bar. President Innes then reminded Rotarians of the "Blue Jean Hoe Down" currently scheduled for February 1st in Tallahassee. The event is in a real barn so wear you blue jeans! The cost is \$35 per person. President Innes indicated that she and Rotarian Jean Norman are going over in President Innes' motor home. President Innes indicated that there are a few spaces left on the bus for anyone interested!

President Innes then called on Rotarian Bromley Dyson, who took the podium to recognize two of our PHS Interact members: Megan Kane (daughter of proud father Rotarian Tim Kane), President of the PHS chapter and member Torey Bergosh. Thanks to Rotarian Bromley for his work with the Interact program. President Innes then presented Paul Harris awards to the following Rotarians; Dr. Henry Roberts (PHF), Chris Pate (PHF +4), Will Merrill (PHF +5) and Jerry Maygarden (PHF +6). Thanks to these

outstanding Rotarians for their generous support of The Rotary Foundation and our club through their giving.

President Innes then called upon Rotarian Sally Fox to bring us some sunshine, introduce our visiting Rotarians and guests along with our military guests. Our speaker drew for our raffle, which was worth \$68 to Charles Gund. Our military quests were LT JG Stephanie Kind, USN and LT Tim Noble, USN. LT JG Kind is a native of Virginia Beach and 2009 graduate of UCLA earning her degree in political science. LT JG Kind has been selected for training as a Naval Flight Officer. LT Noble hails from Aurora Illinois and enlisted in the Navy to become a Nuclear Power Electrician's Mate in 1991. In 2000. LT Noble earned his bachelor's degree in Nuclear Engineering and was commissioned as an officer and entered flight training earning his wings of gold in 2006. LT Noble completed two combat deployments aboard the USS Ronald Reagan before reporting to VT-10 at NAS Pensacola as an NFO instructor. The club thanked these fine officers for their service to their country with a warm round of applause and some fine china.

President Innes then called on Rotarian John Shaffer to introduce Rotarian and program speaker Bryant Perkins, District Executive of the Pensacola Bay District of the Gulf Coast Council of the Boy Scouts of America. The Gulf Coast Council is made up of four districts with about 7,000 scouts. About half of those scouts are in the Pensacola Bay District made up of Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties. Membership levels

include the Cub Scouts (elementary up to 5<sup>th</sup> grade), Boy Scouts (from 6<sup>th</sup> grade through age 18), Venture Scouts and Explorers. The Gulf Coast Council raises about \$475,000 annually to support activities within the council and our club is a supporter of this organization. Other fund raisers include the Gulf Coast Corporate Dodge Ball Tournament, The Jerry Pate Golf Tournament, Sporting Clay Shooting Tournament, and sale of popcorn, among others.

Mr. Bryant told the club about service hours performed by scouts of nearly 8,000 hours in the last year. The Boy Scouts service projects include decorating the graves of our fallen military with American flags at Memorial Day and numerous community service projects performed as a requirement of earning merit badges or attaining the rank of Eagle Scout. At the conclusion of his program, Rotarian David Stafford was recognized for his support of the Gulf Coast Council. Mr. Bryant asked all former scouts to stand and the number of our club's members who were boy scouts was overwhelming. He then asked those who attained the rank of Eagle Scout to stand. Those standing were treated with a round of applause.

After thanking Rotarian Perkins for informative program, President Innes awarded him with a piece of fine china. After thanking all of those who worked to make today's program a success, the meeting was adjourned.
