

Bill is an active volunteer in his community and received a 2002 national "double goal coach" award from the Positive Coaching Alliance at Stanford University in recognition for his work in youth sports.

JMI is a Florida based research and educational organization engaged in the battle of ideas. The Institute's ideas are rooted in a belief in the U. S. Constitution and such timeless ideals as limited government, economic freedom, federalism, and individual liberty coupled with individual responsibility. The Institute's mission is to keep the citizens of Florida informed about their

government and to shape our state's future through the advancement of practical free-market ideas on public policy issues. The Institute achieves its mission through research, conferences and seminars, and a variety of publications.

In keeping with the ideals of JMI, it was only fitting that Bill introduced Benjamin Franklin to the Club to engage in a round of "are you smarter than a Franklin County fifth grader?". This is a program that JMI brings into schools around the state to introduce children to various aspects of financial literacy and thrift. Bill and Ben challenged the club to answer various questions regarding the life and numerous accomplishments of Mr. Franklin who earned the title of "The First American" for his early and indefatigable campaigning for colonial unity. In true Downtown Rotary fashion, our guests were presented with fine china keepsakes as thanks for their presentation to the Club.
