

WEEK IN REVIEW

The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola took place on February 26 at the New World Landing. Roger Brown and Ted Brown greeted arriving Rotarians, and Ellis Bullock Jr. did a splendid job with raffle ticket sales. Britt Landrum was the lucky winner of the \$74 prize.

Chris Kelly led the group in thoughtful prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance. President Innes Richards opened the meeting with newsworthy notes including a reminder that names for Ethics in Business award nominees must be submitted by April 1. Innes thanked the dozens of Rotarians who helped pack nearly 104,000 meals at Manna Food Pantry last Saturday. Rotarian John Appleyard presented a resolution honoring Fr. Jack Gray's life, his devotion to our community, and to Rotary. The resolution was properly seconded and approved unanimously. Robert Mills had Sunshine duties for the day, and he welcomed several quests of Rotarians and Rotarians making up from other clubs.

Today's guest speaker was our own Dr. Judy Bense, the 5th and current President of the University of West Florida. Judy has been at UWF for 30 years, and she is perhaps best known for founding the UWF program of

Anthropology/Archaeology in 1980 and her service as its director for 20 years. During that time, UWF was awarded over 75 grants and contracts totaling over \$6 million. In 2006, she founded the Florida Public Archaeology Network. Judy has an incredible commitment to the community and an ability to generate partnerships between public and private enterprise that has helped UWF flourish and grow, even through tough economic times. Judy outlined the progress and recent successes of UWF, including several new or reaffirmed accreditations and the addition of programs in Social Work, General Business, Music Ed., Criminal Justice, Nursing, Athletic Training, and Criminal Justice. Thanks to a continued growth of the Freshman class, enrollment topped 12,000 in 2011, and residency in on-campus housing is currently over 100%, due in part to the beautiful newly opened Heritage Hall for first-time college students. Another component that has helped UWF gain attention is its Athletics and the 13 NCAA Division 2 varsity teams. In 2012, the women's soccer team earned the national championship, as did the 2011 men's baseball team. The introduction of football is yet another goal of Dr. Bense, where she said, "I'll line the field myself if that's what it takes!"

Judy outlined UWF's Strategic Plan for 2012-2017 which calls for enhanced student access, progression and learning; distinctive teaching scholarship, research. and professional contributions: and community partnerships and sustainable institutional excellence. She also reviewed the Campus Master Plan and discussed the recent acquisition of Scenic Hills Golf Course, the addition of a hotel/housing and conference center near the east entrance that will break ground this summer, and the public/private construction of "University Park" which will be the focal point of campus. University Park will contain a new 170,000-foot student union, retail and food spaces, academic and housing areas, as well as the football stadium. Judy explained the best way for UWF to continue to succeed and grow is for the community to hire its students, get involved with the school in any way, come to the games to show support for the athletic programs, and to encourage public/private partnerships.

President Innes thanked Dr. Bense and everybody who helped make the meeting a success. The meeting was adjourned at 1:00.
