WEEK IN REVIEW

The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held at New World Landing on a beautiful Tuesday, April 2, 2013 starting at 12:00. David DelGallo and Lew Doman did a great job of handling ticket sales and the jackpot was \$64, also six lucky ticket holders won Wahoo tickets for this weekend. President Innes Richards called the meeting to order with the four way test and announced that registration continues for the District Conference to be held on April 19-21. 2013 in Panama City. Clif Payne is still looking for volunteers for the Wheelchair Project. President Innes recognized Morris Marx for his Paul Harris Fellowship and Charles Beall for achieving Paul Harris Fellow plus one. We welcomed the newest member of the Rotary Club of Pensacola, Beverly Jackson, Manager and Relocation Director at Century 21 AmeriSouth Realty. Beverly is very involved in community service and volunteer work. **Bromley** Dyson introduced the President and Vice President of the Interact Club of Washington High School, two very talented seniors with plans for college and both were RYLA participants in the past. President Innes shared thank you cards and letters from those who received the

care packages sent to the troops in Afghanistan and from family members who spent nights at the Rotary Room of the Ronald McDonald House while their children were hospitalized in Pensacola. Earl Hutto provided the prayer and pledge. Sally Fox added humor and Sunshine, introduced the military guests, guests of Rotarians and visiting Rotarians. Bob Gaines and Handsel Butts were present for their Birthday greeting.

Britt Landrum introduced the Speaker, Dr. David E. Altig, Executive Vice President and Director of Research, Research Department of the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta. Dr. Altig serves as an Advisor to Dennis Lockhart, Atlanta Fed President and CEO. Dr. Altig provided a very interesting overview of Fed Policies and Monetary Policies of the Federal Reserve Board and the FOMC. The current policies are primarily composed of the current QE3large scale asset purchase program and the setting of the interest rate by the FOMC of 0% or near 0%. Current policy is set to remain in force until the Fed sees a significant improvement in the overall economy and the unemployment rate declines to 6.5% or less for a sustained

period of time. Fed policy is based on averaging economic forecasts going out for several years for the unemployment rate, jobs growth and growth in the GDP and the signs of inflationary pressures. According to Dr. Altig, the economy appears to be headed toward a slow but steady improvement based on the current strength in the areas of Housing which appears to be showing real improvement, income growth for individuals is showing up, in 2012 there was a bounce in capital investment and an actual growth in GDP of around 2% even with the dampening effects of the tax increases and the downturn in the European economy. Dr. Altig reports that no inflationary pressures are present in the economy at this time. Dr. Altig predicts that slow growth will continue until at least 2015 and that Fed policies will change little until that time. More information is available at http:// www.frbatlanta.org/.
