President David kicked off the meeting with the Four-Way Test and John Trawick led all in the prayer and pledge. John Appleyard delivered his 53rd resolution honoring the life and accomplishments of long time Rotarian and civic leader, Dr. Reed Bell. He will be missed.

All of those who are interested in eradicating POLIO (not "polo" President David!!), Rotary is sponsoring a trip to Africa to assist with that effort. See President David for details.

Wrapping up a worldwide tour and since the Saenger was booked, the infamous Rooters came to the stage to entertain the crowd. Lucky for them that there

were several journalists in attendance to record the event--Great job Rooters!

After Frank Beall won \$75, marriage counselor Chris Kelly livened up the meeting with some Sunshine and jokes about how fights between husbands and wives begin and then introduced our military and other guests.

Program coordinator and past president Jerry Maygarden introduced the program: Sherriff David Morgan. The recently reelected Sherriff, whose department has been in the news recently because of several high profile issues, discussed in depth what he sees as some of the reasons for what we are seeing in society as a whole. The Sherriff's department answers approximately 280,000 calls annually, and Escambia County has the 3rd highest rate of incarceration and 8th highest crime rate in the State. Overseeing a budget of \$80 million and a staff of 1100, he cited the

overall change in the family dynamic that has occurred over the past several generations as significantly contributing to the cycle of crime and single parent family problems. The Sherriff has been frustrated recently with the media attacks on the department especially the ones that were race related. He went on to state that we cannot be afraid as a society to discuss race issues—especially whites. The media often fails to highlight crimes by blacks against whites and that over 93 percent of black homicides are black on black events. White on black violent crime is virtually nonexistent. As a law enforcement officer he cannot be expected to solve social issues - and that we as a county must find a way to break the cycle and culture of poverty and crime. He will continue to "steer the course" and thanked the Club for allowing him to speak today.
