WEEK IN REVIEW

The regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held under balmy summer skies on July 1, 2014. Rotarians and their guests were greeted at the door by the smiling faces of Sherry Hartnett and William Hamilton. Ticket sales were executed flawlessly by Bob Hart and Mark Harden. The meeting was called to order by Innes Richards standing in for newly seated President John Shaffer. Innes then led the club in the Four Way Test. Pete Doyle was called to the podium for prayer and pledge.

Innes then thanked the club for the recognition bestowed upon her at the recent Change of Command dinner. She also announced that an update on the Centennial project will be provided at our next meeting from John Tice.

Collier Merrill was then called to the podium to present the Sandra Robinson award to this year's recipient Connie Bookman. Connie and her staff at Pathways for Change provide a wonderful service to our community and under her leadership that program has flourished.

The raffle pot of \$53 was carted off by Roger Vinson. Wahoos' tickets to 3 games were distributed to other lucky winners.

Hugh Hamilton was then called to the podium for Sunshine accompanied by a smattering of half-hearted applause. Hugh introduced 2 military guests, 3 guests of the club and 1 visiting Rotarian. Hugh then let

go with an outhouse joke that was worthy of hearty applause. Another joke about a character from Pancho was cut short by an interjection of the punch line from a member of the peanut gallery — fineable offense perhaps? Hugh then talked about 2 great American virtues — patriotism and compassion or meeting human needs. A great sermonette to keep in mind over the upcoming national holiday.

Our lone birthday celebrant was not in attendance so there was no Happy Birthday You All to follow the harmonic accompaniment.

Bob Larkin, our new Chairman of the Program Committee, was called to the podium to introduce today's program. Bob proudly announced that his committee has booked all but 1 available date for the coming year - kudos! Bob then introduced Kate Jordan who is the Executive Director of 90 Works, formerly known as Families Kate mentioned that the recent rebranding was prompted by continued confusion between her organization and Families First. The new name is a function of the organization's 90% success rate of getting high risk individuals self-sufficient in 90 days. The starting point is to secure safe housing with monthly rent not to exceed 30-50% housing burden on a monthly budget. Initial funding is provided by the temporary financial assistance program which is funded primarily with private

donations. Most of the individuals entering the program are living in hotels, which is not a viable long term housing solution. A key starting point for success is for clients to agree that they want to work. The also enter a budgeting class which helps them manage their income properly and assists to insure that basic needs are met. Kate and her staff employ intensive case management to keep the participants on track in their quest for self-sufficiency. There are opportunities for donations of bicycles and accessories for the Cycles for Success initiative. bicycles can fill basic transportation needs that are so critical to obtaining selfsufficiency. Participants with substance abuse issues are directed to the appropriate resources for assistance. Many times the participants are living in a chaotic life marked by substance abuse, spousal abuse, child abuse - they must be removed from that environment and taught basic life skills. 90 Works serves an 11 county geographic area stretching from Escambia County, AL to Bay County, FL. They have a \$6 million budget which is funded largely by state and federal contracts. 2,500 households received assistance from the organization in 2013.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
