
- Planning for the new Y appears to be proceeding, which means Bill Phillips will be having busy times ahead. Bill's career, from boyhood, was with YMCA.
- As we get ready for the club's centennial here are some statistics out of our past: a) Seven current members are descendents of charter members. b) The club has had seven men who became district governors, and c) In 100 years we've had twenty-two men and women serve as club secretaries.

Bob Larkin introduced our program -Andrew Kent and attorney and advisor with Saltmarsh, Cleveland and Gund, who gave us an update on the progress (or lack of progress actually) on the business economic loss (BEL) settlements coming as a result of the BP Deep Water Horizon accident in April 2010. Unfortunately, BEL claims make up 102,000 of the 282,000 claims and only 10,600 have been paid to date for approximately \$2.2 billion. Over 66,000 claims remain totaling a possible \$4-4.5 billion. The problem is the process to pay those claims has just recently restarted per court order but, as Andrew reported, continued litigation and appeals of the process is expected from BP. There is plenty of blame to go around - from the failed and overwhelmed initial claim process started by BP, to the one that followed which was even more of a PR nightmare... Mr. Fineberg's Gulf Coast Claims Facility which at one time employed thousands of claim adjusters but was completely subjective and nontransparent. The current "new" claim program started in 2011 and is administered by Mr. Juno in New Orleans. It was supposed to be

transparent and formula based - but BP soon became frustrated with paying claims to large law firms and other groups who could provide the onerous paperwork in order to get their claims paid when many small business were struggling with providing the documentation. The formulas were a problem too. By fall of 2012 and into 2013 the process was completely off track again and the process stopped in October 2013 and it was off to the courts again. BP was ordered by the court to start the process again in May 2014 under what now is called Policy 495 -Andrew says we have now come "full circle" with the BEL claims process as 495 is very subjective and not transparent (think the Fineberg plan). Basically, what you have is a hot mess and all claimants are going to suffer Andrew opined.
