

## The Rotary Club of Pensacola District 6940 Club 4248

#### WEEK IN REVIEW

It was a sunny and beautiful spring day in downtown Pensacola outside, and Rotarians and guests were greeted with a warm smile and a firm handshake from Rotarian Dave Aronson who greeted all Rotarians and guests. Once inside, Bret Barrow sold raffle tickets.

President Shaffer was away so past President, Innes Richards, reprised her former position as club president in his absence and called our meeting to order. Innes led Rotarians in reciting the Four Way Test. She then called upon Rotarian Robert Mills to lead us in prayer. Thereafter, Robert led the club in the pledge of allegiance to our flag. Innes then asked Rotarian John Tice to draw the winning raffle ticket which was worth \$55 and was won by Kathy Horton-Brown.

Rotarian Scott Grissett was then called to the podium to provide some sunshine and introduce our visiting Rotarians and guests of Rotarians. There were no military guests at the meeting this week. Rotarian Handsel Butts was the only Rotarian celebrating a birthday (and 52 years of ) who was in attendance and the club serenaded him with a rousing version of "Happy Birthday Handsel."

Rotarian Richards then called upon Rotarian John Tice to discuss the Centennial Park Playground project. Rotarian Tice told the club that the planning committee had met with the contractors to finalize and prioritize final elements of phase one of the construction of the Centennial Playground Park. Projected funding for the playground is at \$600,000 which will mean that not all elements of the project will be included in the initial construction. Specifically, the clock tower and observation deck envisioned will add about \$200,000 to \$250,000 to the project cost. Instead, a simple clock tower without the observation deck and bridge will be constructed.

At present, current fund raising puts funding approximately \$500,000 leaving approximately \$100,000 left to make the minimum goal for phase one of \$600,000. Several committees are seeking additional funding from different sources including individual donations (participation) by at least 100 club members (approximately 75 Downtown Rotary members have pledged at least \$1,000 each), contributions from other Pensacola area Rotary clubs, corporate participation from entities associated with the Community Maritime Park and the Pensacola Blue Wahoos and from various foundations and individual philanthropists.

At present, significant elements of the project will have to be left out unless additional funding in the approximate amount of \$400,000 can be identified. These elements include the area of the playground for children ages 2 - 5 and the clock tower and observation deck cannot be restored to the initial construction without

additional funding. If you, or someone you know, would like to become a major partner in the Centennial Playground, they should contact John Shaffer or John Tice for additional information.

Rotarian Innes then recognized Sherry Hartnet who briefed the club on the club's Community Grants Committee. As in past years, the committee has approximately \$10,000 in funds available for community grants. The committee is working hard to review the applications of various community organizations for grants which total \$80,000. The committee is working hard to fund these worthy requests, but clearly have some difficult choices.

Rotarian Innes then spoke about the Group Exchange Program and international projects of our club. She related the gratitude of the people of Gurdur India for the desks that were provided along with fresh water from a Rotary well. The Rotary Club of Gurdur partnered with our club to make these projects a reality. Rotarians Innes Richards and Jean Norman were able to visit the community and bring us pictures of the new desks and students who are using them as well as the benefits of clean water.

Rotarian Innes thanked all those Rotarians who helped make today's meeting a success, the meeting was adjourned.
