WEEK IN REVIEW 10/25/2016

It was a beautiful fall day and as participants arrived at New World Landing they were welcomed by Chuck Michaels. President Brian rang our meeting to order and asked Cal Moore to lead us in prayer and the pledge to our Nations flag. The lucky ticket sold by Tim Kane gave Lou Doman the \$53 pot. After which, Margaret Stopp brought Sunshine to the meeting, introduced our U.S. Navy guest, guest of members and visiting Rotarians. She also led us in birthday greetings with the help of Rotarian John on his lickin' stick.

Our program, introduced by Betty Roberts, was the FSU College of Medicine presented by Dr. Paul McLeod. Having worked at the Naval Hospital, University of South Alabama and practiced in Milton, FL, Dr. McLeod heads up the Pensacola office for this program. With no teaching hospital

associated with FSU, local hospitals and physicians are the nucleus of the model for this college for the 3rd and 4th years of the student's apprenticeship education. This program is in its 15th year in Florida and student graduates are on the same level as other medical school graduates. Students work in local hospitals with local physicians with the majority of the graduates remaining in Florida and the local communities.

There were 6,240 applicants for 120 spots making this the 2nd most competitive medical school program in the country, just behind Mayo Medical School. Their mission is to meet the healthcare needs of Florida. Family medicine is the top selected discipline and the 1,000th student just graduated. There are 20 former students practicing in our area with 10 of them being trained in Pensacola. Their connection with the local medical community during their

schooling assists in keeping them in our community.

FSU School of Medicine will begin sharing a facility in the new UWF athletic program building set for December, 2017. This will expose the students to the other UWF colleges of health. Medicine is now a team practice due to its complexity. Starting in the fall of 2017, a physician's assistant program will begin in collaboration with UWF. There will be 40 spots open for this area. Physicians that teach in the FSU program attend training for this FSU model. Over 92% of the teaching physicians remain in the program.
