WEEK IN REVIEW 01/16/2018

Despite the cool weather, we were greeted with a warm welcome by **Terry Terrell** as we entered New World Landing. **John Tice** and **Fletcher Tidwell** offered a chance to win the split pot with the purchase of tickets.

Past President Andrea Krieger called the meeting to order. (Paul Tobin, our current President, is progressing well in his recovery but still out.) Following the Four Way Test led by Andrea, followed by prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance led by Lisa York, Andrea recognized and thanked Betty Roberts for leading the Plant a Tree Project. Special announcements included notice of the Rotary Against Hunger Project with the Manna Food Bank on February 24th led by Preston Forshee. Last year's event was a great success, and with sufficient volunteers this year's event will also be a success. Please consider volunteering for this project. Vicki Campbell brought Sunshine into the room with a joke about an Alabama fan barber, a Seminole customer, the Pope and Italy. Vicki recognized and welcomed the four visiting Rotarians and seven quests in attendance. There were no military guests. Birthdays were also recognized

Andrea introduced the speaker, our very own Mark Harden. Mark is a 30-year Navy veteran and serves in many roles related to veteran activities, including the Southern Region President for the Navy League. (He's also the program chair for our club.) The subject of Mark's presentation was the Navy League of the United States, commonly referred to as the Navy League. It is a national association with nearly 50,000 members who advocate for strong sea services with all branches of the service, not just the Navy. It was founded in 1902 at the suggestion of Theodore Roosevelt. Open sea lanes are critical for many reasons, such as the main transportation mode for goods, National defense, and projecting strength internationally. Three of the national officers of the Navy League reside in Pensacola.

The Navy League, a civilian organization, has three missions: to enhance the morale of active-duty personnel and their families, inform Congress and the American public of the importance of strong sea services, and support youth through programs such as the Naval Sea Cadet Corps and Navy League Cadet Corps as well as Junior ROTC, Young Marines and STEM programs. Additionally, councils host many events in their local communities to support sea service members and their families. Local Navy League Programs include the Sea Cadets' Independence Squadron, a chicken barbecue, an annual POW/MIA remembrance, a summer social, an enlisted personnel recognition event, inviting enlisted personnel to a luncheon hosted at the Admirals' Club. Mark emphasized the importance of family support and their sacrifices for those who serve. As such, he started the Spouse Appreciation Program in 2005. The organization also "adopts" ships and participates in ship commissioning. It is a very active organization.

We also learned that Mark is a singer. A tenor. He's sung in several venues. Despite multiple requests for him to perform for the group during the meeting, Mark declined. Perhaps he'll join the Rotary Rooters if encouraged enough. Even though Mark didn't sing for us, we were entertained by an opera singer in an event next door. Mark couldn't compete with that voice at times given the volume and notes sung. He simply paused his presentation for us all to enjoy the intruding voice. We even joined the other group with applause for the singer. Mark is available at our meetings for any follow-up questions or further discussion about the Navy League.
