### Week in Review 01/30/2018

Open the door, however, and it was quickly discovered, based on the 46-degree temperature, that winter has not yet released its grip of Pensacola. Oh well...at least we found warmth upon arriving at New World Landing with the greeting received from the smiling, friendly greeters, Matthew Vinson and Roger Vinson. Ticket sales by Doug Werber and Al Coby later produced a very happy winner (and lots of disappointed losers) with a \$53 jackpot.

Assistant District Governor, Innes Richards, called the meeting to order. Following the Four Way Test, the prayer and Pledge of Allegiance were led by Sally Fox. Special announcements made by Innes included that the Board recently approved no lunch charges for potential members invited by members to participate in our weekly meetings (limited to three per potential member). This mean "all y'all" need to think about who might become a member and to invite them to join us.

Additional announcements included that volunteer sign-up sheets are available for this year's Rotary Against Hunger campaign with Manna. Families are invited but children need to be at least 10 years old. Innes announced the District Governor challenge for the one-million-dollar dinner for the Foundation. She pointed out multiple ways to

contribute, including posthumously. Innes also recognized **Margaret Scott** for her many, significant contributions by awarding her the Major Donor Pin. Our newest member, **Richard Fountain**, was also introduced by **Ed Ranelli**. Welcome **Rick!** 

Not to be outdone with the sun outside, **Lori Menke** brought us brighter sunshine inside. Finding a joke or two that goes over well seems to be a challenge for all Sunshiners, or is just our fun in giving our Sunshine volunteers a friendly, hard time? Lori announced there were no military guests, introduced our three member guests and the two visiting Rotarians. Member birthdays were also celebrated. **Leonard Swartz** and **Norris McMahon** were present to receive the outstanding choral rendition of Happy Birthday by the membership.

Mark Harden introduced our guest speaker, Susan L. Davis, FACHE, President/ CEO of Sacred Heart. Susan has been the CEO since 2012. She started her remarks by informing us that the severe flu strain seems to be declining as the frequency of "B" cases is increasing in the balance. Good news for sure! As she moved into her presentation, she shared that Sacred Heart is expanding from a primarily hospital-centric care modality to moving services closer to where people reside, hence the number of urgent care centers seen developing around the greater community.

Moving member services to where people are and reducing time spent in  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{ER}}$  rooms are the

reasons for this move. She shared that about 103,000 patients are seen each year in the ER, most of whom don't need ER care. Even with the three clinics opened to date, the ER visits have seen an increase of 6-7%. Sacred Heart's three primary objectives with the clinics is to increase access to medical services, improve ease of service, and reducing the time to receive service. In keeping with this theme, Sacred Heart is now moving into telemedicine (phone and video) and using the internet to make assessments and review needs.

Other significant items shared were that Sacred Heart has teamed up with the University of Florida to begin kidney transplants locally. To date. Birmingham was the nearest place for transplants. With this new service, patients in our region will have better access. The Studer Children Hospital, a \$75 million building project, is progressing well and will be another regional success story. On a final note. Susan shared with us the news of "Sprout," a beautiful, friendly blond that provides comfort for certain patients. This blond is a Golden Retriever trained as a comfort animal for children in the hospital. If you want to win a trivia contest, ask the players if it's true that Sacred Heart borrows a horse to help in patient treatment. In fact, they borrow one once a month to help with recovery. The traditional medical field is expanding in directions many of us would never have imagined. Bring on the future!
