WEEK IN REVIEW

The regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held under sunny summer skies at New World Landing on May 31, 2016.

Rotarians and their guests were greeted warmly at the door by John Clark and Al Coby.

Ticket sells were ably managed by Hill Turner under the watchful eye of Tim Kane.

President Andrea called the meeting to order and led the group in the Four Way Test.

Hugh Hamilton was called to podium and performed his usual masterful job leading the group in prayer and the pledge to our flag.

President Andrea called Betty Roberts to the podium to announce her effort to assist the Programs Committee in soliciting ideas for future programs. A form for this purpose was circulated and Betty would greatly appreciate input from the membership on this initiative. Andrea reminded the group of the upcoming change in command event and requested that all interested in attending submit their RSVP to Kerry as soon as possible.

Jeff Lewis then took the podium to perform Sunshine duties. Jeff reminded the club of key events that have occurred throughout history on May 31. Jeff introduced a guest of a Rotarian and one visiting Rotarian. None of the birthday boys or girls were in attendance so there was no singing performed by the group. Jeff then capped off with a Catholic schoolboy joke that was well received and elicited chuckles from those in attendance.

De De Flounlacker was then called to introduce the program, Rick O'Connor with the University of Florida/IFAS Extension Service. Rick leads the Florida Sea Grant program for Escambia County. For 50 years, the National Sea Grant College program has worked to create and maintain a healthy coastal environment and economy. The Sea Grant network includes 33 programs based at top universities in every coastal and Great Lakes state, Puerto Rico, and Guam. The programs of the Sea Grant network work together to help citizens understand, conserve and better utilize America's coastal, ocean and Great Lakes resources. While research is a crucial component of Sea Grant, transferring the knowledge to the people who can benefit from it is just as important. Sea Grant's network of more than 300 outreach experts work with coastal

community members and decision makers to provide informal education and transfer new technologies.

Key issues of focus in our area are fish kills and health advisories. Both of these issues are prompted primarily by the effects of stormwater entering our local waterways, primarily bayous. A program called Bringing Back the Bayous was established to obtain feedback from local citizens and obtain their support of initiatives to deal with these issues. Sea Grant also trains volunteers to perform monitoring and testing to augment the efforts of local government whose capabilities are often hampered by budget constraints. Other issues tackled by Sea Grant include clean marina designation, microplastics and seagrasses.

De De thanked Rick for an informative program and presented him with a piece of fine club china for his effort.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
