### **WEEK IN REVIEW 9/13/2022**

The September 13, 2022 meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was called to order at 12:05. There were 31 Microsoft Teams attendees. President Bruce Partington led the Four-Way Test, and Lynne Tobin led the prayer and pledge.

Program chair Ed Wonders introduced the week's speaker Sally Fox, past president of our club and current area governor for our district. She gave an update on Rotary International's efforts to fight polio. She is not a doctor so cannot provide medical expertise, but poliomyelitis is a viral infection that commonly infects children under 5. Humans are the only known carrier, and it typically spreads through contaminated water and affects the nervous system, leading to paralysis and sometimes death. Pre-vaccines, nearly every child was infected. In the 1980s, there were 350,000 cases per year in 125 countries. Many outbreaks in the US since 1894. The iron lung was invented in 1929 to help those unable to breathe for themselves. Dr. Jonas Salk completed a (nonliving) vaccine in 1955, and Dr. Albert Sabin created an oral version for children (using a live/attenuated version of the virus) in 1960. In 1979 Rotary International began a multi-vear project to immunize children in the Phillipines. PolioPlus was launched in 1985 with \$120M fundraising target. Rotary partnered with WHO in 1988 to launch Global Polio Eradication Initiative. In 1994 polio was declared eliminated from the Americas. A huge push in 1995 immunized 165 million children in China and India in one week. 550 million children had received the oral vaccine by 2000, when Western Pacific region is considered polio-free. In 2003 only 6 countries were polio-endemic, dropping to 4 in 2006. Rotary had contributed \$800M by 2009, when Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation pledged \$355M to be matched by additional \$200M from Rotary. Rotary contribution passes \$1B in 2011. India became polio-free in 2012, Africa in 2019.

It costs an average of \$3 to fully protect a child against polio. There are 3 "wild" types of polio. Only wild type 1 is left (only 23 confirmed cases in 2022), types 2 and 3 were eliminated. There is also a vaccine-derived type 2 version, related to the live oral vaccine, which is what has occurred in New York. Wild polio in Afghanistan, Pakistan and Mozambique. Vaccine-derived polio happens when attenuated virus from vaccine circulates in under-immunized communities long enough to revert to strong form. One unvaccinated New Yorker is now paralyzed, and others infected were unvaccinated or immune-compromised. Polio vaccination campaign effectively stopped during covid, which contributed

to this. Scientists are trying to make oral vaccine more effective, since it's much easier to administer than injected vaccine.

What can you do? Become a Polio Plus Society member and contribute \$100 each year until world is declared free of wild virus. There are 2:1 matches that gets as high as 5:1 match. Locally we have a local fundraiser, Pints for Polio, September 29 at Perfect Plain. \$15 advance or \$20 at the door, Perfect Plain donates first beer and 100% of proceeds go to polio effort. Rotary has contributed more than \$2B and helped immunize more than 3 billion children in total. Sally then shared a video from Rotary.

Bruce Partington asked about the immunization rates of the communities in New York where infections have occurred. Sally confirmed they have been largely unvaccinated. Sally's mother had polio and she is a big fan of vaccines. With no other questions, Bruce thanked Sally for the update.

Announcements: Bromley Dyson's wife Puddy has died. Next Tuesday 9/20 we will be back at the Yacht Club but will have Teams available. Reminder of Pints for Polio on 9/29, Chris will send out a sign-up. Our local pledge drive is underway, please pledge whatever you are able to do. We continue to offer 3 free lunches to prospective guests.

Bruce talked about the HANWASH program that may be a successor to Polio Plus. Several Rotary districts have started funding this effort to provide sanitary water to Haiti. He shared a brief video about the initiative.

Roger Vinson mentioned that naturalization ceremonies typically have two Rotary representatives, and there is one coming up. He asked for any volunteers.

Scott Ford was in charge of Sunshine but had some technical difficulties. Bruce welcomed guest Aaron Bercovitch, who relocated to Pensacola from Arizona, where he was president of a Rotary club. This week's birthdays are Charles Kahn Jr. and Howard Reddy. Lynne asked if anyone has tried eating ice cream with a fork, and Ed said he did but couldn't tell a difference.

Next week's speaker is Tom Pace, commodore of the Pensacola Yacht Club. Meeting adjourned at 12:51pm. Minutes submitted by Joe Vinson
