From Sanford, Florida, Andy's inspiration for editorial cartooning was his uncle, Pulitzer Prize winner Doug Marlette. While attending the University of Florida, Andy served three years as art director and editorial cartoonist at the Independent Florida Alligator, the largest independent college newspaper in the U.S. He has received several awards for his cartoons, was a national finalist in the Society of Professional Journalists' Mark of Excellence Awards, and a finalist in the Scripps/Howard Foundation's Charles M. Schulz Award for Best College Cartoonist. After graduating from college in 2005, Andy worked independently until he began his first daily newspaper job at the Pensacola News Journal in 2007 where he is a cartoonist and graphic artist.

Andy entertained Rotarians with a slideshow of mostly funny, sometimes sobering looks at some of his best work from the past few years. He ranges from national and presidential political humor, to state and local politics and events. Nobody is safe from Andy's jabs; whether it's the President, a Congressman, or a BP executive, he pulls no punches. The St. Pete Times and the Tallahassee Democrat regularly pick him up, and the New York Times has used several of his comics. Andy's Uncle Doug was a firm believer that editorial cartooning be considered an important element of free speech, and Andy continues to uphold those principles passed to him. He has certainly been a welcomed addition to the News Journal, and we're glad he chose Pensacola to be his home. Many of Andy's works can be seen at andymarlette.com.
