Announcements from President Ray included a reminder about the February 17 Rotary International leadership conference; recognition of our very own John Shaffer being recognized as an "Angel in our Midst"; and that he has had a discussion with Five Flags Rotary about food service at our meetings.

The Rotary Rooters then entertained the crowd with a few historical songs. Bob Gaines was the lucky raffle winner today, taking home \$60, thanks to the ticket sales efforts of Bobby Behr and Tim Kane. Scott Grissett introduced today's speaker, Alex Lincoln, Director of Strategic Partnerships for the Andrews Institute. Joining him was SGM Harold Hill, U.S. Army (Ret.) Special Forces, who is currently Director of Business Development for Tactical Performance at the Andrews Institute. Alex shared stories of his athletic career and contrasted them with heroic stories of military athletes who have been injured in war. He talked about Marcus Luttrell, Navy SEAL and author of "Lone Survivor" who was severely wounded, and how the Andrews Institute changed his life for the better. Wounded warriors such as Marcus Luttrell inspired the Andrews Institute to want to help our soldiers.

Originally, the Andrews Institute continuum of care was developed for pro athletes. Pro athletes expect and receive the best in sports medicine. Today this level of care is available to everyone. The newly created Eagle Fund was established to provide military athletes – those who defend us -- access to the pro sports model, a warrior continuum of care. The Andrews Institute's goal is to return military athletes to the fight and improve their quality of life long-term.

The Andrews Institute maintains that these military warriors give their best to protect us; and it is our obligation to give back our best to them. Alex closed his presentation by letting Rotarians know they can help in 3 ways. First, pray for these military warriors. Second, partner with the Andrews Institute Foundation; no funding is too small. And finally, tell people about this innovative initiative that is right here in Pensacola.
