WEEK IN REVIEW

The April 13th, 2010 meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola took place on another beautiful spring day. Rotarian Nigel Allen greeted members and guests, and Bryan McCall and Doug Werber sold raffle tickets. Nathan Kahn was the week's lucky winner of the \$59 prize.

President Margaret opened the meeting, and John Trawick led the group in thoughtful prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance. Rotarians had the privilege to hear Pensacola's History In Song performed by the Rotary Rooters. Thanks to the Rooters, Downtown Rotarians now know that Rebel troops fired on Union troops trying to gain entry to Pensacola Harbor by water an hour before the first reported shots of the American Civil War were fired at Ft. Sumter that dark day in 1861.

R.P. Doyle had Sunshine duties, and he welcomed three guests of members and three visiting Rotarians. In honor of the four Navy flyers who were lost in Georgia during a training mission this week, Roger reminded us that our men and women in uniform are solely responsible for giving Americans our daily freedoms that we often take for granted.

Pensacola Young Professional President, Kristine Karsten. Kristine gave a brief history of the PYP, and said the organization began in 2006 with help from Downtown Rotarian Evon Emerson. Twelve young businessmen and women were at the helm in '06, and in 2010 they now have a membership of 250. The PYP operates under five main objectives:

- Focus on attracting and retaining young talent
- Develop, enable and educate Pensacola's next generation of leadership
- Work to make the Pensacola Bay Area a great place to live, work, and play for young professionals
- Showcase Pensacola as a dynamic community to young professionals
- Address issues affecting this demographic and work to find solutions

To help accomplish these objectives as well as to help members improve their personal leadership and networking skills, the PYP uses a team approach that includes the following areas:

- Member Services
- Economic Development

- Quality of Life
- Networking

The PYP is currently concentrating efforts on two programs: Internship Pensacola, which provides local college students with valuable internship opportunities during their summer semester in an effort to retain young talent in the community. And with assistance from The Studer Group, the Pensacola Professional Development Institute program looks to define leaders, embrace their role in the community, and to educate and equip them to be future leaders.

The Young Professionals are hosting a golf tournament on Friday, June 4th at Marcus Pointe, and part of the proceeds will benefit the Gulf Coast Kids House.
