WEEK IN REVIEW

The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola took place on a cold, Tuesday, December 7, 2010, 69 years after the bombing of Pearl Harbor. Members and guests were greeted at the door by Frances Yeo and David Bear. Andrea Farage and Betty Gail Peters handled the ticket sales. Skip Furlong purchased the winning ticket. President Ray Jones called the meeting to order with the Four Way Test and a moment of silent remembrance for Rotarian Walter E. (Gene) Smith who passed on Sunday, December 5, 2010. President Ray reminded all of the continuing sacrifice of all those serving in the military away from home as well as military families during the holidays. Betty Gail Peters was recognized as a Paul Harris Fellow and received a standing ovation for her contributions in many ways to Rotary. Earl Hutto provided the prayer and pledge. Andrea Farage provided an update on the success of the Rotary Bedroom in the new Ronald McDonald House. Andrea estimates that during the first 100 days in the new home, the Rotary Bedroom has provided

approximately \$19,000 of benefits to the guests who have occupied the room for 93 of 100 nights. Andrea briefly shared some of the joys and pains of the parents of ailing children who come from neighboring towns of the Panhandle and were able to stay in the bedroom provided by Rotary and the Ronald McDonald house.

Frank Beall provided the Sunshine and introduced the many guests of Rotarians and visiting Rotarians. Birthday wishes went out to Glenn McDonald, Chirs Klotz and Beverly Patterson.

President Ray introduced the Rotary Rooters who provided the program of a wonderful musical review of Holiday times as they may have been celebrated in Pensacola on December 7, 1917 in the early days of both Naval Aviation training in Pensacola and the Pensacola Rotary Club. The Rooters entertained and educated us with a re-enactment of a gathering of young aviators in the Pilots ready room at what is now NAS to sing songs and celebrate the season in

1917. We imagined that Chevalier, Mustin, Bronson and Towers were there to discuss the current state of naval aviation and dreams of the future and the outlook for Pensacola Naval Air Station in the years to come. The Rooters sang a tribute to Pensacola from the musical "Sea Plane" popular in the day, and renditions of traditional carols as the young pilots would have done. All together a great way to remember Pearl Harbor, appreciate the joys of Rotary service, honor the rich history of naval aviation in Pensacola and begin Holiday celebrations. President Ray thanked the Rooters and all who served to make the meeting great.
