

The passport contains simple vocabulary words covered in the classes so that the students may take them home and have them for review.

The Global Corner is a 503(c)(3)organization. Already, the Global Corner has reached over 7,500 students in Escambia County with hopes of reaching 7,500 to 10,000 students in the coming year.
