Dr. Brown is the Chief Medical Officer for the new VA Ambulatory Clinic located next to the Naval Hospital in Pensacola. Dr. Brown said that the VA Clinic in Pensacola is the largest one in the country and has received major support from Congressman Jeff Miller and Senator Martinez. Groundbreaking on the clinic began in May 2005 with the completed

building costing 55 million and 18 million in equipment. The mother ship of the VA Clinic is headquartered in Biloxi. There is a hospital sharing agreement with the Naval Hospital next door. The clinic provides primary care for 1200 patients and includes women's health. Services include: sick call, dental, sleep lab, hyperbaric, neurology, gastroenterology, cardiology, pain management, general surgery and ancillary services. Admission to the VA Clinic is dependent on a number of criteria such as military injuries, retirement, financial hardships, household income and service connections. Dr. Brown closed his talk with questions and answers.

President Keith thanked all who attended and expressed "Make Dreams Real" as the meeting adjourned.
