The Aug 28th, 2018 meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola took place at New World Landing. John Shaffer and Ed Wonders warmly greeted visitors and members at the door. Jack Williams and Charlie Sherrill handled the fifty-fifty raffle sales.

President Betty convened the meeting with the Four Way Test. Dr. Jimmy Jones led us in prayer and in the Pledge of Allegiance to our flag.

President Betty announced the upcoming Rotary Foundation and Grant training is scheduled for September 29th. Betty congratulated member Leslie Hunter-Huff on the recognition recently received concerning the Boys and Girls Clubs of the Emerald Coast. President Betty also reported that the finishing touches are being made on new Galvez statue, located on Palafox Street.

Betty next relayed Mr. Appleyard's "This day Pensacola History." On August 31st, 1765, trader John Stuart (sp?) set-up a training encampment on King George's Wharf. King George's Wharf is now known as Palafox Street. Club member Frank Beall won the 50/50 drawing.

DeDe Founlacker did a wonderful job as Sunshine. This was despite her unsuccessful attempts to research Sunshine's duties on the websites of rotaryleadershipinstitute.org, Rotary.org and District 6940. Dede introduced all visitors in attendance and recognized this week's members with birthdays. Amazingly, seven of the nine members with birthdays were present. Mark Harden introduced our featured speaker, Mark Faulkner, president and chief executive officer of Baptist Health

Care Corporation. Mr. Faulkner earned his bachelor's and master's degree at the University of Alabama, and is a past recipient of the PACE Business Leader of the Year Award.

Baptist Health Care is the only locally owned, not-for-profit health care organization in northwest Florida and south Alabama. BHC comprises four hospitals, three medical parks, Baptist Manor, Baptist Leadership Group, Andrews Institute for Orthopedic & Sports Medicine, Lakeview Center, Baptist Medical Group and Cardiology Consultants. With more than 6,500 employees and employed physicians, Baptist Health Care is the second largest non-governmental employer in northwest Florida.

.Much of Mr. Faulkner's talk was focused on; who BHC is, what they do, and why they do it. The following is their mission statement:

The mission of Baptist Health is to improve the health and well-being of individuals, and to promote the sanctity and preservation of life, in the communities we serve.

They achieve this by being trusted partners in the communities they service.

For example, one third of BHC's annual revenue is generated by Lakeview Center's initiative, Global Connections to Employment. GCE provides employment to individuals with disabilities, in fourteen states, including the Washington DC area.

Some other Partnerships referenced were Mayo Clinic, Families First Network, and the YMCA.

After a Q&A period Betty thanked all who helped make today's meeting a success.
