MINUTES

Bob Larkin greeted all Rotarians, visitors and guests with a warm greeting and firm handshake. Rotarian Dr. Jimmy Jones sold raffle tickets.

President Ray called the meeting to order and led the club in the Four Way Test. He then called on Rotarian Charlie Blackwell to lead us in prayer. Thereafter, Rotarian Charlie led Rotarians in the Pledge of Allegiance to our flag.

President Ray then called upon Rotarian John Appleyard to read a resolution honoring the life of Rotarian Ron Richards who died after a brief illness on May 11th. The list of professional and personal accomplishments for Rotarian Ron was long and reflected a real zest for life. Rotarian Ron rose to positions of leadership in all aspects of his life. All who were fortunate enough to know Rotarian Ron felt at once that he was their friend. Rotarian Ron's generous personality is perhaps best reflected in the fact that he was not only a Paul Harris Fellow, but also a member of the Paul Harris Society. This represented Ron's sustained commitment of giving to the Rotary Foundation. Rotarian Ron leaves behind many wonderful accomplishments and he will be greatly missed. The proclamation was unanimously adopted and made a part of the club's permanent records. A copy of the proclamation was presented to Ron's wife, Rotarian Innes.

President Ray called upon Maria Goldberg to make an announcement regarding the final Downtown Rotary Social which is planned for the Fish House on Thursday, June 16th. Hors d'oeuvres will be provided by the Fish House with many drink specials. All members are urged to attend if possible.

Rotarian Frances Yeo then introduced two high school students who submitted the winning essays in an essay contest [sponsored

by INTERACT] on the meaning of the Rotary Four Way Test. Runner up honors and a check for \$200 went to James Mozur. First place went to Heather Kite along with a check for \$300. Each of these outstanding young people presented their essays to the club. Well done!

President Ray then drew for the raffle with a pot of \$64. Rotarian Ron Martin took home the money! President Ray then called upon Rotarian Scott Grissett for Sunshine and to introduce guests of Rotarians, visiting Rotarians and our military guests. Our first military guest was Lt. Lindsey Buzzell who hails from Hyde Park, New York. She is a 2004 graduate of the United States Naval Academy having earned a degree in Oceanography. Lt. Buzzell earned her designation as a Naval Flight Officer in 2006 and joined VP-26 after completing Fleet Replacement Training in the P-3C Orion that same year. Lt. Buzzell is currently assigned as a Naval Flight Officer Instructor and Mission Commander at VT-10. She is married to Capt. Robert Buzzell, USAF. Our other military guest was 2nd Lt Spencer Boggess. 2nd Lt. Boggess is a graduate of Texas A & M (gig'em Aggies) a graduate of Marine Officer Candidate School in Quantico, VA. 2nd Lt. Boggess reported to Marine Aviation Training Support Group 21 in July and served as platoon commander for Aircrew Candidate School before beginning flight training. 2nd Lt. Boggess is currently completing Intermediate Naval Flight Officer Training at VT-10. Both received hearty applause from the membership for their service and some fine china for their coffee!

President Ray then called upon Rotarian Chris Kelly to introduce our guest speaker, Marnie Needle, President of IMPACT 100. Marnie told us that the Pensacola Chapter of IMPACT was formed by Debbie Ritchie after she read a magazine article on the

organization's founding in Cincinnati. IMPACT 100's intent was to raise \$100,000 from 100 women donors who would then make a lump sum grant of \$100,000 to a non-profit organization. In its first year, IMPACT raised more than \$200,000 and made donations in excess of \$100,000 to not just one, but two worthy organizations! Each year IMPACT solicits applications from area non-profits in five areas. These are "Arts and Culture", "Education", "Environment, Recreation and Preservation", "Family" and "Health and Wellness." Pensacola's IMPACT 100 has grown each year and has now become the largest such organization in the nation. IMPACT 100 has raised an amazing \$645,000 for distribution in 2011. This will bring IMPACT 100's total contributions to area non-profits to an astounding \$3,587,000 in just six years! Talk about difference makers!

Despite its success, IMPACT 100 is actively recruiting new members and has limited scholarship opportunities for qualified applicants. While the organization is justifiably proud of its substantial financial contributions to the local non-profits, it is also very proud to have been able to raise awareness in our community of the many very worthy non-profits and the ways in which people may become involved in their important work other than through monetary donations. The club gave Mrs. Needle a round of applause for the outstanding job this remarkable organization is doing in northwest Florida - well done!

After a fascinating program, Rotarian Chris presented Mrs. Needle and Lori Storey- Myrick with some china for their collections. President Ray thanked all those who worked to make today's program a success and ended with the reminder that Rotary is about "Building Communities and Bridging Continents."
