seek out historical locations on the go. They demonstrated how the software worked on an iPhone via live streaming including videos, texts, and photos. The program knows where you are via the GPS in your phone and will guide you to the closest “historical” location in the database. The “App” is free at the App store and works quite well. Over 43,000 World-wide historical sites have been uploaded to the program and UWF students have been involved in the development since the beginning. MEMBERSHIP PROPOSALS

Dr. Kyle Marrero

Dr. Kyle Marrero currently serves as vice president for University Advancement. He joined the University of West Florida in Fall 2005 as the director of the School of Fine and Performing Arts and chair of the Department of Music. In August of 2009, he was appointed interim vice president of University Advancement at UWF and in August of 2010, he was appointed permanent vice president. Marrero’s accomplishments in his two years of service as VP include total annual gifts of more nearly \$6 million to the UWF Foundation. In addition, faculty and staff giving reached the 51 percent participation level - the highest in UWF history since records have been kept. He holds bachelor’s and master’s degrees in vocal performance from Bowling Green State University and a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Michigan.

As chair of the Music Department and director of the School of Fine and Performing Arts, Dr. Marrero garnered success in his abilities to navigate curriculum, personnel and development issues. He successfully achieved NASM accreditation and approval for degree title changes from Bachelor of Arts to Bachelor of Music, developed and implemented a new Bachelor of Music Education degree and helped develop a B.F.A. program in Music Theatre delivered in partnership with the Music and Theatre departments. He has guided assessment innovations in fine arts curriculum and has steered new standards in tenure and promotion guidelines appropriate to the music discipline. New initiatives to aid in recruitment and community service have included the addition of the UWF Summer High School Music Camp, the UWF Summer Kodály Workshop (level I certification) and the UWF Music Academy.

Dr. Marrero has worked to establish and maintain community partnerships with the Pensacola Symphony, Pensacola Opera, Pensacola Museum of Art and the Pensacola Little Theatre. In working with Martha Lee Blodgett, director of Development at UWF, fundraising successes have included the purchase of 18 new Steinway pianos, making UWF a prestigious “All-Steinway” School and the naming of the Warren and Helen Wentworth “All-Steinway” Piano Program. He currently serves as the coordinator of the Phillips Jazz Piano Competition helping to promote this event to national prominence. University service activities have included the UWF Football Implementation Team, UWF Football Feasibility Study, UWF Web Advisor Committee, UWF Integrated Marketing Team, College of Arts and Sciences Chairs Leadership Group and Chair Mentoring Team and he currently serves on the Board of Trustees of the Rehabilitation Foundation of Northwest Florida.

As artistic director of Pensacola Opera, Dr. Marrero led the company tripling its annual budget and doubling its patronage in his eleven years of service. Mainstage productions continue to garner critical acclaim and have helped facilitate granting opportunities with the National Endowment of the Arts and Opera America. Demonstrating his commitment to education, he founded the Artist-in-Residence program at Pensacola Opera. The program, encompassing 16 weeks of residency, provides training to young artists newly out of graduate school and delivers outreach and educational programs reaching more than 20,000 children and 15,000 adults in Northwest Florida and South Alabama.
