## WEEK IN REVIEW

The weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Pensacola was held at New World Landing on a memorable Tuesday, May 28, 2013, one day after the observance of Memorial Day. Members and guests were greeted at the door by Hugh Hamilton. Mark Harden did an outstanding job of handling ticket sales. President Innes Richards called the meeting to order with the four way test and reminded all of the Installation Banquet to be held on July 9, 2013 at Heritage Hall. Nominations are being accepted for the Sandra and Grover Robinson awards. Forms are available from Kerry. Charlie Sherrill inspired us with the prayer and led us in the pledge. Chris Kelly brought on the sunshine and welcomed guests of Rotarians and visiting Rotarians. Birthday greetings went out to John Clark, Art Hufford, Chris Jensen and Rodger Doyle who were present. Roger Vinson and Tony Basil were the winners for the ticket raffle, \$54 dollars in the pot and tickets for the Wahoos game this weekend.

Dr. Jimmy Jones introduced the Speaker, Paul A. McLeod, MD Senior Associate Dean for Regional Campuses and Regional Campus Dean of the FSU School of Medicine Pensacola Campus. Dr. McLeod first spoke to the

Rotary Club of Pensacola in 2003 about the newly instituted regional community based medical school located in Pensacola and this year the FSU College of Medicine Pensacola Campus celebrates its 10<sup>th</sup> year. The Pensacola Campus is one of six regional community-based medical school campuses in the state that provides third and fourth-year clinical training at regional medical school campuses through affiliations with local physicians, ambulatory care facilities and hospitals. Local partners from the Pensacola area direct the students' rotations in family medicine, internal medicine, pediatrics, surgery, obstetrics-gynecology, geriatrics, psychiatry and emergency medicine. One mission of the medical school is to attract physicians to the local area and the results have been outstanding. 59% of their graduates return to Florida, 66% are performing primary care and 33% practice within 10 miles of their clinical training site. The regional community-based medical school concept is a departure from traditional classroom or University Hospital based training and is an attempt to solve some of the looming issues for access to medical care. Dr. McLeod cited three converging conflicts on the horizon for medical services. In his view, a perfect

storm in brewing brought on by the aging population of baby boomers and the need to manage the associated chronic conditions of aging, the critical shortage of primary care physicians and the new attitudes toward more work/life balance for physicians. The concept of regional community-based clinical training was put into practice in hopes of strengthening the ties to the local communities, improving recruitment to certain areas and increasing access to medical services for some elderly and rural populations. Ten years down the road, the results appear to be fantastic and the students are receiving outstanding training from practicing physicians and local partners who are fully invested in their training. The FSU College of Medicine Pensacola Campus trains 20 third year and 20 fourth year students per year and provides an economic impact of approximately \$6M/year to the local economy.
