WEEK IN REVIEW

The Rotary Club of Pensacola met on a cool, overcast day in October. Members were greeted by Bryant Perkins and Tim Kane, who also graciously agreed to sell raffle tickets. Mike Layton was the lucky winner of the \$46 raffle purse. President John opened the meeting and led members in the 4 Way Test. Judge Vinson delivered the prayer and pledge. Chris Kelly spread a little Sunshine, and tried to raise the bar on the humor. No military guests were present, but we enjoyed the company of several visiting Rotarians and guests.

Evon Emerson introduced Allison Hill, CFO of Lakeview Center, as our guest speaker. Ms. Hill discussed the three arms of Lakeview Center, each of which has a significant impact on our community. Lakeview Center is best known for its Behavioral Health Division, which helped 25,163 people in 2013 alone. Lakeview Behavioral Health has nearly 60 programs and services for

children and adults with mental health issues, drug and alcohol dependencies, and intellectual disabilities. Those services range from in-patient and residential treatment to a wide range of outpatient programs including trauma services, psychiatry, counseling, day treatment and intensive outpatient treatment for addictions. Prescription drug use is the nation's number one growing drug problem, and suicides outnumber homicides two to one.

Family First Network is responsible for the safety, stability and well-being of abused or neglected children in Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa and Walton counties. FFM was created to meet this responsibility, and aided 8200 children in 2013, providing foster care, adoption, protective supervision and other services. FFM answered 187,000 child abuse calls in 2013. One in twenty children are typically referred to abuse

investigations nationwide.

Gulf Coast Enterprises reaches the furthest geographically. GCE has contracts in 13 states and the District of Columbia. A non-profit company that provides employment opportunities for people with disabilities and to war-wounded heroes, GCE is known for providing high quality service to its customers. In 2013, 2,000 people were employed by GCE, with more than 75% of them either having a disability or having been wounded in military service. Twelve percent of our area's population has a disability of some sort, and 70% of people with disabilities are unemployed.

Lakeview Center has grown from a tiny one-employee basement clinic into a complex multi-state network. Lakeview's mission is helping people overcome life's challenges. President John adjourned the meeting.
