President Paul opened the meeting with the 4 Way Test.

President Paul announced he and Innes Richards applied for a grant of \$107,000 from the Impact 100 Group. The funding would be used to begin phase two of the playground. The combined Rotary Clubs would need to raise an additional \$43,000 to completely fund the project. The second phase of

the project will have a plaque recognizing the combined Rotary Clubs.

President Paul introduced our Guest speaker, Mark Goto, Captain U.S. Navy. He is the Commanding Officer of the Navy Medicine Operational Training Center (NMOTC). Capt. Goto is a native of Fresno, California, he graduated from the University of California, Los Angeles with a Bachelor of Science in Biology and completed medical school at the University Of Pittsburgh in 1995. While in medical school, he was awarded research fellowships from the Howard Hughes Medical Institute and Deafness Research Foundation and conducted research in balance disorders.

The mission of NMOTC is to provide training for Operational Medicine and Aviation Survival and is recognized as the global leader in operational medicine, innovative and responsive to the

challenges of the warfighter. The NMOTC supports Navy Medicine's lifesaving mission by training these medical professionals and in many cases the warfighter themselves for theater specific contingencies.

Headquartered at Naval Air Station Pensacola, Fla., NMOTC oversees 6 detachments and 12 training centers in more than 60 facilities spread across the U.S. More than 600 personnel support some 65 instructional programs within aviation, surface and undersea warfare, expeditionary forces, and special operations; supporting readiness for the Navy, other U.S. armed forces and U.S. allies globally.

President Paul thanked everyone for assisting with today's meeting and adjourned the meeting.
