WEEK IN REVIEW

What a gorgeous sunny day for Rotary fellowship. Guests were greeted with a welcoming smile and handshake from Bob Hart and Sherry Hartnett.

President Keith opened the meeting with the four-way test and Robert Mills delivered the prayer and pledge. President Keith reminded everyone that the installation banquet will be July 7th. Roger MacDonald read a poem and recognized Vince Currie for recently receiving an honorary Doctor of Canon Law degree from Sewanee: The University of the South. John Appleyard shared with the group that the Rotary Club of Pensacola was presented the 2008 Bell Ringer Award from the Salvation Army, having raised more than \$10,600.

Ron Richards received his 4+ Rotary pin in recognition of his dedication to Rotary. Ron informed everyone that the paperwork for the new Rotary Club of Pensacola Seville was submitted with 60 charter member applications. The club will meet Tuesday evenings at 5:30 at Lili Marlene's in Seville Quarter. The purpose of the new club is to introduce younger people to Rotary as well as to provide all area Rotarians an evening club to attend. as a result of the fine ticket sales by Ed Wonders and Richard Sherrill. The Rotary Rooters then entertained everyone with their rendition of three Stephen Foster songs. Ms. Sunshine, Sally Fox, welcomed guests, military guests and visiting Rotarians, told a few jokes, and led "Happy Birthday to You All" accompanied by John Appleyard on piano.

Leonard Swartz introduced today's program speaker, Sheriff David Morgan. Sheriff Morgan acknowledged the challenges faced by the nation, state, and local area, but is confident that we will come through these tough times. He discussed some areas of focus over the past four months he has been in office. The department has been restructured to shift more staff onto the street. Now only 30% of the staff are in administration while 70% are on the street. They have focused on differentiating between wants and needs in the department and as a result have found \$4 million in savings for next year's budget.

The traffic division is up and running. Sheriff Morgan cautioned the group against moving violations as his department has significantly stepped up the number of tickets written. In December they wrote 29 or so. From January to now, they have written nearly 4,000. They wrote so many tickets they had to re-order them

Another area of focus has been aggressively working across the county to reduce street level crime and drug dealing, making 512 arrests. Sheriff Morgan said that gangs are an issue in our market, and 15 have been identified. Of those, four have been recognized by Florida statute, meaning that an additional 10 years can be added their sentence if convicted of a crime. The preeminent gang here is the west-coast affiliated Bloods. Sheriff Morgan said these gangs are very mobile and brutal. He said citizens need to unite with law enforcement. One of the most important things we can do is form neighborhood watch groups and get to know our neighbors, letting them know when we are out of town, etc. The Sheriff's department needs citizens to call them when they think a crime is being committed.

President Keith wrapped up the meeting, thanking everyone for their service.
